


"This will be OUR story — our passion for the car and track driving.

1st Annual Badger Bimmers' Trap Shoot

November 9, 2013

Dateline: November 9, 2013, Muskego, WI.

The First Annual Badger Bimmers Trap Shoot is in the record books, and (as far as we know) all participants have made it safely back to a well-deserved warm fire and adult beverage of choice.

The friendly competition was held on the shores of beautiful Muskego Lake at the Boxhorn Sportsman's Club where a brisk 40 mph wind and overcast

skies eliminated distractions like mosquitos and errant sea gulls.

The weapon of choice seemed to be the 12-gauge shotgun, although a 20-gauge was available for those seeking less recoil. The 12-gauge will, on average, transmit about 20 ft.lbs. of force into your shoulder (imagine laying on your back and having a colleague drop a 1 pound weight from 20 feet hitting your shoulder); it throws the lead shot 200 to 300 yards down range, although accuracy deteriorates quickly

We ran three rounds of 25 shots per participant before we decided to pack it in, with the following statistics:

after about 40 to 60 yards.

- Number of shots fired: 350
- Number of clay birds shot out of the air: About 175 (Scores ranged from less than 25% hit to a little over 50% hit)
- Pounds of lead shot deposited down range: About 18 pounds.

Participants were enthusiastic about a return engagement, albeit at a warmer and less windy time of year. Watch the upcoming events section of the web page! **b**i

Formula E

Petrol-free Racing!

Part 1

anctioned electric car racing is coming in the form of Formula E. I recently came across an article on Formula E in one of the Automotive Engineering magazines I receive. This sparked my interest since battery powered vehicles have very limited range and cannot be recharged in any time-frame that comes anywhere near refueling time of a liquid fueled race car.

Here's my summary of the info I found on the Formula E web sites.

The FIA (governing body for motorsports worldwide) has established a new racing series, Formula E. The championship series will start in 2014 and will be held around the world on street circuits in major cities. The series is being promoted by Formula E Holdings, which has contracted fabrication of 42 cars built by Spark Racing Technologies (SRT) using a Dallara chassis made of carbon fiber and aluminum. The electronic system and drive train is being designed and supplied by McLaren Electronic systems. The Formula E cars are powered totally by batteries, no additional power system. The battery power pack is a lithium ion system being developed and provided by Williams Advanced Engineering, part of the Williams group that includes the Williams Formula 1 Team.

The overall system integration, performance optimization, power train efficiencies and electrical safety will be overseen by **Renault**. Renault was selected based on its experience in electrical vehicle production, and extensive experience in motorsports from its Renault Sport F1 programs.

Michelin has been selected as the official tire supplier through 2015. They are providing custom 18-inch treaded all weather tires for the series. The all-weather tire will be the only tire available for the series. Fox Sports has confirmed an international multi-media deal with the FIA Formula E championship.



In Part 2, David provides some performance specs on these cars; the Format for the practice, qualifying and race; and a racing schedule. Watch for it in the next immer: January/February 2014.
