


This month's cover photo features Roy Wicklund's '88 e28 M5 which took home top honors in the Race & Track Car Class at the Oktoberfest 2010 Concours

President's Message

t appears that my swan song to the presidency of the Boston Chapter was a little bit premature. After several conversations with the board and friends (and some serious arm twisting by all) I was persuaded to serve one more year as president. I agreed with the understanding that this was absolutely, positively the last year I would be president. So be prepared for another year of touring car race reports!

Although some things will remain the same, other things will be changing. We are excited to have a new member, Eric Kaul, joining the board (assuming our members give him the stamp of approval in December), and we have identified several new members who are gearing up to take a more active role in Chapter operations in 2011 and 2012. I am hopeful that this new energy will help the board meet the needs of the Chapter's changing membership demographics.

2011 will also see changes in the Bimmer. With our increased communications via the website and email, we no longer need a monthly print reminder during track season. We will continue to publish bimonthly, with a "special issue" late in the year for a total of 7 issues annually (only 3 less than in the past). The "special issue" which will debut this year in December will be used for several things. The issue will feature articles about the Chapter activities and provide a reference for members who might want to know more about the club and its events. Starting in January of 2011, we will use this issue as a recruiting tool. It will also in be included in a welcome packet sent to all new members to provide an overview of the Chapter's activities.

The board is also working on new social events, to get more members involved. Our first new event was scheduled for early November when the Autocross participants met in Boston for a new, casual awards ceremony at the Bell-In-Hand Pub. We also continue to improve our successful track events, by working with other Chapters to develop exciting events without exposing the Chapter to excessive financial risk.

I couldn't close the racing season without a report on the World Touring Car Championship (WTCC). The WTCC was on track for a very exciting finale in Macao which is an unbelievable street course. However, in the last race coming up to the finale, BMW ran the race with sequential transmissions which were approved by the race stewards. Now, anybody who has followed Formula 1 or any other series run by the FIA will know that rules can be interpreted in rather creative ways by the FIA. In this case it seems that the FIA is going to rule the transmission illegal even though the race was run and the stewards OK'd the transmissions. If that decision holds then BMW will have lost the championship before the last race. This is the type of action that has BMW moving to the DTM and away from Formula 1 and the WTCC. So it looks like there will not be any major series championships captured by BMW this year. It will be interesting to see how BMW changes focus with the expected move in 2010 to the DTM. Until next month, Stay on Track! ♦

ith the autocross cones packed away for the winter, it's time for wheel-to-wheel racing karting style. The world-class facility of F1 Boston (www.f1boston.com) in Braintree, MA will again be the site of our indoor karting events.

Qualifying rounds: There are 2 more Sprint qualifying rounds running on the "City Track #1" at F1 Boston. Each event consists of three, 12 lap races and a 15 lap runoff. The runoff will be composed of the 12 drivers with the fastest "average" lap times. The top 5 finishers in the runoff will be invited to compete in the Joint Track Championship Event on Sunday April, 3, 2011. If there's a repeat qualifier in the 2nd or 3rd Sprint round, then the 6th finisher in the runoff will qualify. For each of the remaining Sprint rounds - scheduled for Sundays 1/30/11, and 2/27/11 – arrive in Braintree at 9:00 a.m. with the first race leaving at 10:00 a.m., and the event concluding around 12 noon. To participate you must be 18 years old and have a valid drivers license. You can bring your own full-face helmet or driving suit, but if you don't own them, F1 Boston provides all the necessary equipment.

Championships: The series will culminate with a Joint Track Championship Event on Sunday April 3rd. You must earn a spot in this event by your performance in one of the 3 Sprint qualifying races, so registration is "by invitation only." The cost will be \$195 per driver, but all 16 drivers will be on track for the entire event.

Registration: Registration for the 2 Winter events opens in December and January, and the registration fee will be \$75 per driver.

his was the sixth Oktoberfest [O'fest]
I've attended, and each one seems
better than the last. The Elkhart
Lake, WI location was spectacular with
a 4 diamond host hotel (Osthoff Lake Resort), a legendary and world-class track (Road
America), and many, diverse and well-organized
events throughout the week long O'fest schedule.

New track experiences a major draw

While the many driving and Concours events generate great fun and excitement, it's the camaraderie of old and new friends that make O'fest a truly great and unforgettable experience. Each time I go, there are more people that I meet from previous O'fests, all of which seems to magnify the enjoyment of experience. Believe it or not, there are a number of Club members who have attended nearly every O'fest since the first ... and that's over 40 years.

The big draw for me in deciding to make the 18 hour trek to this year's O'fest was the opportunity to try a new track, in this case the historic 4.0 mile, 14 turn Road America road course. Not to mention the chance to participate in an auto-x event that was to be held on the Road America shifter cart track, eliminating the need for many cones!!

Nice to look at, nicer to drive

I decided to take my '88 e28 M5 to this O'fest. Its restoration and many modifications since the '03 Cannonball One Lap of America make it an excellent Driver's School car, a competitive auto-x car, and a worthy challenger in a concours event. The week's first event was the Concours, which had many beautifully maintained BMWs from vintage to current models, including a 327, a 507, two M1s, numerous 2002's and Bavarias, etc. My M5 was entered in the Race and Track Car Class and was fortunate enough to garner 1st Place.

Next on the schedule for me was the auto-x event with it's four runs on the very twisty and narrow uphill, then downhill, cart track. The M5 and I placed 1st in our Class and had the third fastest time of the day, which included 6 other Classes. I have my many years of

Candidate for President

I was amazed that it worked on anything, right now! But oh, were they expensive! \$300 for a little laser temperature toy is not easy to swallow. That kind of money could buy a set of new winter tires, but now I'm making too much sense. I couldn't afford it back then, but like most electronics, pyrometers' pricing has gone down significantly in recent years. So when I got an email from a friend recently saying that they were on sale at Harbor Freight for \$29.99, I jumped on it right away. A day later, I had my very own pyrometer!

How does it work?

The pyrometer doesn't lie when it comes to tire temperature.

• **IF:** the outside shoulders of the tires are warmer than the inside's temperature, you probably need to

add more negative camber, thicker sway bars, stiffer springs or any other suspension adjustment that would reduce body roll in turns and widen the tires' contact patch.

- **IF:** the inside shoulders of the tires are warmer than the outside. this means the outside shoulder of the tires doesn't get a chance to do as much work as the inside, again reducing the width of the contact patch. This may be due to running too much negative camber or setting tire pressure too high.
- IF: the fronts are much hotter than the rears, you probably have some under-steer or you are not using the rears to their full potential under acceleration (assuming a RWD car).
- IF: the rears are almost as warm as the fronts or even warmer, you are probably sliding the rear of the car too much, which is rarely the fastest way around the track.

All of these might be related to suspension, tire pressure and your driving style. Key thing is, it should give you a fairly good indication on which areas to target for improvement.

Track setup, here I come!

It was exciting to measure my car's tire temperature first time I brought the pyrometer with me to the track. The front tires' insides were nearly 20 degrees cooler than the outside shoulder. It was evident that with

such a significant temperature difference, I needed considerably more negative camber than the -1.5 degrees I was running in the front. This is the most you can get out of my Z4 M Coupe's stock setup without camber plates or camber bolts, and the pyrometer's reading put it all in clear perspective. The rear tires' outside shoulders, however, were 5 degrees cooler. It looked like I was running too much negative camber in the rear. The front tires were also measurably hotter than the rears, so I must be leaning on them quite a bit in turns and maybe not using enough slip angle to allow the rears to put all the power down when exiting. And the "pyromaniac" fun doesn't stop with the tires. Pop the hood, check the temperature inside the engine bay. Point at the rotors. Wow, shouldn't these be on fire by now based on the temperature reading?

A great toy at home

I found really good use for the pyrometer at home as well. Discovery: you don't always have to measure hot stuff; cold stuff is just as much fun to measure too! Now I could check the temperature of the beer bottles in the fridge before I pop one open. I am not taking chances with that Coors Light cold-activation bottle, where part of the label turns blue when the ideal serving temperature has been reached. And

frankly, it doesn't matter how anybody else measures things. It's more fun when I measure them my way! Remember this conversation from Caddyshack?

Judge Smails: Ty, what did you shoot today? Ty Webb: Oh, Judge, I don't keep score. Judge Smails: Then how do you measure yourself with other golfers?

Ty Webb: By height.

A pet's favorite toy

To our cat Marshmallow (I also wanted to call our guinea pig Brownie but was overruled), the pyrometer's laser beam is like a tennis ball to a dog. He may be asleep upstairs, but as soon as he hears the beep from the pyrometer's on switch, he rushes downstairs ready to go catch that pesky red laser dot. He contorts his body in the air acrobatically, runs around in a circle and finds a way to climb high on smooth walls. Even when he is exhausted and he lies down on the kitchen floor to catch his breath, his eyes are still feverishly tracking the beam. All of a sudden, the virtually unknown pyrometer has become a hugely popular toy at home. To use another Caddyshack quote:

"This crowd has gone deadly silent, a Cinderella story outta nowhere. Former greenskeeper and now about to become the masters champion." (Carl Spackler taking practice swings on the garden flowers).

You Know You Want It!

A pyrometer would be a great present for Christmas. It might even be the most versatile tool you have ever bought. Hopefully Santa's elves make these types of toys in the North Pole. Or you could get a cat and play Def Leppard's Rock of Ages (from their 1983 album Pyromania) for them:

We got the power, got the glory Just say you need it and if you need it Say yeah! ♦

Behind the Wheels by Ina Ames

he time of year for gift giving is here. It's also a good time to subtly let your friends and family know what you'd like besides another sweater, tie or a new vacuum cleaner. Below is a gift list for anyone or everyone on your shopping list, or for you to leave subtly about the living room table (or email to them all) so you'll get something useful. Just leave a Xerox on the living room table with what you'd like circled ... or if you're like me, buy them for yourself.

Gifts that clean:

Wheel cleaner: Many of our customers adore Auto Magic Magnificent for cleaning their wheels. It's only offered to wholesalers so we bottle a concentrate here. We like it because it's non acidic and won't take the clear coat off the wheel. It also doesn't require breaking one's back to get wheels clean. If you're not local, then make sure any wheel cleaner is no or low acid. If the cleaner says "put on and take off in 2-5 minutes" it's low acid. If you don't get all the acid off, it'll eat away the clear coat off your wheel and then oxidize your wheel.

Wheel Wax: We offer Wheel Wax because our BMW CCA club members asked us to carry it. You put it on your clean wheels and it makes it so much easier to clean your wheels next time. It's a great product available at many retailers and online.

NevrDull: NevrDull is a product that cleans chrome and polished wheels that have no clear coat. Your grandmother probably used it in her kitchen. It's an inexpensive cleaner and is available at most hardware stores for a fraction of the cost of most chrome cleaners. It works for your boats and the chrome on your car also. We also sell it at the shop.

Cape Cop Polishing Cloths: This is again for Chrome and Polished wheels without clear coat. I use this as a backup if the NevrDull didn't get off all the dirt. This is available in hardware stores. It smells like bubble gum, but it's not nauseating.

Chamois cloths or microfiber clothes are very useful for cleaning both the car's interior and exterior.

Remember: Never clean your wheels when you've just been driving. "Hot" wheels cause chemical reactions that can leave permanent damage to the face of your wheels.

Functional Gifts:

A Tire Pressure Gauge helps you check the pressure of your tire. The correct pressure for your car is on the plate on the driver's side door. This is a good tool to keep in the garage so everyone in the family can use it. I am aware that many people believe that these gauges are not absolutely because of the requirement of tire pressure monitoring systems on all vehicles up to 10,000 pounds. However, the law requires the system to indicate when the tire pressure is 25% down, which is very low in my book.

A tread depth gauge measures the tread depth of your tires. I always suggest that you should replace all tires at about 25,000-30,000 miles because while the depth may look good, the steel belted radials will probably be worn.

Locking lug nuts & a spare key: Locking lug nuts are an option on most car. If your tires are valuable to thieves, they are imperative. A good friend bought a Honda Fit which is not a high risk car - but her aluminum wheels were. She came out one morning and found her aluminum wheels gone and her car on the ground. If you get anyone locking lug nuts, be sure that they have a specific place for the key and that they know to check for the key

A lug nut socket: A lug nut socket. It's a very good idea to have a lug nut socket in your car. You need a 17mm thin wall socket for your BMW and most German cars. A lug nut cross bar has four sizes on it -17mm, 19mm, 21mm, and 3/4.

anytime the key has been used.

PB Blaster or WD40 are extremely useful for the home garage. While we also recommend duct tape, you can't fix anything on your wheels or tires with either duct tape or WD40, but they're nice stocking stuffers.

A road hazard safety kit is extremely useful.

Portable wheel blocks are very helpful in many situations. I've known people who use them in their garages to keep from hitting the wall.

Gifts just for fun!

Wheel totes and felts are another useful and fun item. The Wheel totes help easily carry up to 22" wheels. The Felts cover the face of the wheel with padding. The totes come in a box of two, so you need two boxes for a set of wheels.

Replica wheels: A new set of replica wheels for the winter. High quality replica wheels are not an oxymoron. You just have to know where to shop. If you're interested in buying a set of wheels you need to know the year, make, model, and size of the wheels. If you call us, please make sure you have both the diameter of the wheel (16, 17, 18 etc.) as well as the width of the wheel (7, 7.5 etc.)

New tires: Tires are also a good gift. You need to know all the information on the tire. Please refer to my July 2010 article (online at the Boston CCA club) for information on how to read a tire.

BMW valve covers: BMW valve covers are fun.

I hope this list has given you food for thought for the holidays. You may find some additional ideas for gifts on our online store at rimandwheelworks.com. Wishing you and yours a Happy Chanukah and Merry Christmas. ♦

it crew, pit sign, pit in my stomach, pit, pit, pit! There were so many "pits" running through my head as we exited the highway on our way to the big Team Enduro race. I was going to drive myself crazy if I kept this up. But there was a lot riding on me. Not only was this going to be my first event with the BMW CCA but I was also the only female racer! I could feel my nerves increasing as we approached the entrance to the F1 Outdoors track in East Bridgewater, MA. Our team

Our team was comprised of me, my brother John Rackowski, our family friend Ryan Mitchell, and my boyfriend Jeremy Perron. My brother and Ryan had participated in track days, but Jeremy was the only one with any karting experience. As we stood listen-

ing to the rules and guidelines for the event, I could feel that pit in my stomach growing. The words they were speaking were like gibberish to me. My brother placed his hand on my shoulder and whispered in my ear "we got this." We were in a similar position having never been on this track before, but my brother had a confidence I was lacking. What I needed was to get on the track and calm my nerves.

Pre-race jitters:

We couldn't have asked for a better day. The sun was shining and there was a crisp breeze in the air. We headed toward pit lane to inspect our karts and begin our practice and qualifying laps. We would have 20 minutes to familiarize ourselves with the track and changing drivers while setting a qualifying time. My brother, John, would head out first for our team with me following. After approximately 5 minutes we held out our custom pit sign indicating it was time for him to come in. As he neared pit lane my anxiety hit an all time high- I was really going to do this! The tires screeched to a halt and I hopped in while Jeremy and Ryan pushed the kart. And just like that I was off!

On the track

In a matter of seconds all my anxiety and nerves ceased. The feeling of being so low to the ground was instantly exhilarating and I sped into the first turn. "I could get used to this" I thought. Turn one down, turn two a little sloppy but I managed, but turn three was where I was completely unsure. It was an extreme hairpin left. Jeremy had advised me to "come in high, brake, and then give it the beans". So that's exactly what I did; pretty successfully I might add. As I came out of turn three I noticed the spectators and wondered if they could tell I was a woman. "I bet they can't" I thought as I reeled






toward the bouncing S turn. It was a lot more bouncy than I anticipated, but I managed to stay in the kart and off the grass. The final turn before the straight seemed like cake now. I flew by as Jeremy, Ryan, and my brother gazed on. And before I knew it, our pit sign was waived and it was time for me to come in. Had it really been 5 minutes already? I came into pit lane and hopped out just as quick as I had hopped in. As I took off my helmet, one couldn't help my notice my ear to ear grin. This was AWESOME.

The race:

Jeremy would be our lead driver for the race. As he headed out, John and I stood there, brother and sister, leaning against the railing. We watched as teams pitted and changed drivers exhibiting extreme levels of teamwork. We gasped as first time drivers spun out on turns they were unsure of. We witnessed the teams tire as they neared the end of the race. And all the while John pointed out trouble spots he noticed on the track, giving me point-







ers on how I could better handle turns and where I should pass. There is something to be said about the bond you have with a family member that allows you to trust what they say. I was amazed by how my brother was able to spend the same amount of time as me on the track and see and feel things I couldn't. As they say, he is a natural.

The finish:

After 2 hours, 6 pits, 5 driver changes, and a reverse in direction, we ended up placing 7th overall. Ironically, the first place finish went to a team of drivers that had each registered individually. Though we didn't take the top place, I'm still more than happy with how our team did. And more than that, I'm happy with myself. Despite the fact that my entire body was sore for the next few days, my karting experience was everything that I could hope for. I was able to participate in a day of good competition among other car enthusiasts and share it with my brother. What more could a car girl ask for? ◆

Import AutoWerks: Undercarriage tech session

ne of the great benefits of BMW CCA membership within the Boston Chapter are the Undercarriage Tech Sessions hosted by local BMW Dealers and Independent shops who graciously close down their business for a day, stiff arm their regular non-CCA member clients and allow OUR members to scurry freely beneath the lifts like kids in a candy shop, asking the shop mechanics for their free advice and all the while celebrating the BMW marque.

This was the exact scene at the Import AutoWerks in Braintree, MA on Saturday, October 16th, where BMW Master Tech Alvin Lui and his team of expert mechanics: Anthony Liu, Henry Deja-
