So, three years ago the Board and I decided we needed to tighten our belt on subsidies. We were very successful, and we rebuilt our war chest.

Time to share: The Chapter is giving back! We just had the final Board of Directors meeting for our current Board. While we have been pretty "stingy" with spending previously, the BOD was very generous this time, so chapter

and national members and teen drivers will benefit greatly!

 The first expenditure began with a great presentation by Scott Blazey regarding the BMW



Club Foundation Member Challenge Grant drive. Scott was asked to serve on the Foundation Steering Committee, and the BOD approved a \$3600 commitment to the BMW Club Foundation over three years, with eighty percent earmarked to go to Teen Street Survival. A generous club member is matching contributions, so this donation will actually mean \$7200 total. I think most of us will agree that no member has done more for our chapter, or BMW CCA as a whole, than Scott Blazey. To underscore Scott's contributions, the \$3600 contribution was made in honor of Scott. Thank you for all you have done, Scott.



• Wanna fix that BMW, but don't have the right tool? The second significant expenditure the BOD approved was a budget of \$3,000 to spend on specialty repair tools for the new "Club Tool Box." These tools will be available at little or no cost to members for use at our tech sessions. If this program is successful, we will purchase additional tools as we move forward. The BOD believes this is a great way to give back to our members, and is also a great recruiting tool—pardon the pun—to attract new members.

Part of the manner we can help fund the above, as well as grow other future events and

activities, is the electronic newsletter initiative noted on page 6 of this issue. This will save a considerable amount in printing and postage cost.

I'm not quite gone from the BOD yet, as I will serve one more year as Vice President if elected. I truly hope someone will step up to take that position in 2015, however, and then succeed our 2014-15 President in 2016. A real succession plan is what I have always hoped for, so as VP in 2014, I will make it my mission to update the Chapter Bylaws to give better guidance on this and other issues. As we all know, guidance is worthless without people to follow it, however...

Request to members. Please consider stepping up and volunteering in the coming year. Volunteering is a great way of getting into the club leadership culture. From there, consider volunteering for a BOD position as Joe Myers just did. The club needs you. A big thank you to the following people for stepping up this past year to help with events: Joe Myers, Tricia Nygren, Mel Grindol, and Ryan Neis.

Thank you to Ryan Staub. In closing, I'd like to thank the person who originally got me into the club. I won't retell the story of how this happened, as most of you have heard it before, and some have heard it multiple times, but I want to personally thank Ryan for introducing me to the Club. Ryan will be turning over the baton of DEC (Driving Events Coordinator) to

John Fickel for 2014. So, as chapter President, I want to thank Ryan for doing a great job over the last several years as DEC. Kirk Kiloh's shoes were big ones to fill, and Ryan did an excellent job. Firsts for the chapter under Ryan were two joint DEs; the



No Excuses DE at Hallett; the Flat Out Classic, which was the largest undertaking in our chapter's history; an Adult Car Control Clinic; and an ITS (Instructor Training School). Ryan will be staying on as Chief Instructor and BOD member. Thank you Ryan.
