# E36 Real-World Upgrade: Cup Holders You Can Use!

Sure, most people wanting to modify their BMWs are looking for either more power, better handling or simply individualization. Anyone who's been in an E36 for more than five minutes knows that there's one thing they're severely lacking, however, at least if they've tried to bring along a cup of coffee or bottle of water.

As great as the E36 chassis is, the cup holders were like a bad joke the Germans wanted to play on the U.S. customers. It wasn't until small energy drink cans came along that anything could fit in them, so they've ended up being left empty, or holding sunglasses, phones, or just being used as tiny trash cans on the road.

Over a decade later, there's finally a worthwhile solution. Real cup holders. I mean, the kind that can actually hold cups! Coffee on the go? No problem! Mediumsized water bottle? You betcha!

Thomas Hancock, president of Origin Equipment, has an OE-looking replacement that clicks right into the factory tray, and

even utilizes replaceable rubber tabs to hold things still (replacements are included).

Now, when I say they "click right in," that's not entirely accurate. It does take a little bit of quality fun time with a marker and a Dremel to cutaway some plastic bits in order to make room for the wider base, but it's a small price to pay to quench your thirst on a road trip.

I'd suggest making easy-to-see marks with something that stands out more than a marker before cutting, and be sure you cut off enough plastic to get fitment correct, but it's a relatively easy and fun project overall, and a way to tell our favorite Bavarians, "Hey, it may have taken us over 10 years to find a real solution, but check this out!"

This is a genuine drop-in replacement for the worthless factory units, and at just under \$40, plus shipping and 30 minutes of your time to install, it's absolutely worth it: http://www.originequipment.com/products/ oee36cupholder
