



Our thanks to BMW South County in El Cajon for renewing their support for ourAutocross Program for another year!

Note: We do run if it's raining—you'll learn more and your tires will wear less—so if you see some unusual drops of water falling from the sky, grab your raingear and head to the Q! Also, the helmet standard has changed to require Snell 2005 or 2010 ratings. Check yours now to be sure it's up to date—rentals are limited.

The entry fee is \$65, including breakfast items, lunch and beverages. You can pay online if you register in advance at http://sdbmwcca.motorsportreg.com, or with cash or check if you wait to register onsite. You must be a BMW CCA member to participate, and you can join online at www.bmwcca.org in advance. Please print and bring your membership confirmation if you have not yet received your BMW CCA membership card. We check membership of all participants at the gate. Our Chapter autocross policy gives priority to members who are driving BMWs or MINIs. Members driving non-BMWs will be allowed to participate if space is available.

REMEMBER: IF REGISTERED ONLINE, **BRING PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP** AND ARRIVE BY 7:30 (BEFORE ON-SITE CUT-OFF) TO KEEP YOUR RESERVED SPOT

When you arrive:

- 1. If you registered online, stop at the gate to sign the waiver and notify the Gate Greeter. Your name will be checked off the pre-registration list. All participants must show their BMW CCA membership card. Those who did not register online will receive a numbered card at the gate in their order of arrival; take it to the Registration table. There is no guarantee that spots will be available for those who wait to register the day of the event.
- 2. Empty all loose items from your car, then go through the Tech Line and have your car inspected. Bring your Tech card and you will receive Tech and helmet stickers.
- 3. Take Gate card and Tech card to Registration to get checked off for pre-registration or pay your \$65 entry fee. You will receive car numbers to place on your side windows.
- 4. If you don't have a helmet, you can rent one from the club for \$10.
- 5. Your entry fee of \$65.00 includes one lunch and unlimited beverages. Additional lunches can be purchased at Registration for \$7 each.

Gates will open at 6:30am; tech and registration will open at 7:00am. Tech will close at 8:20am and no cars will be inspected or allowed to run after this time. There is a mandatory drivers meeting at 8:30am and the course opens for runs at 9:00am.

4C ALL 4 cylinder BMW models (except E30 M3)

Stock 6 or 8 cylinder BMWs up to 295 factory horsepower

6M Modified 6 or 8 cylinder BMWs up to 295 factory horsepower

TS Stock 6-8-12 cylinder BMWs over 295 factory hp, M cars before 1994

TM Modified 6-8-12 cylinder BMWs over 295 factory hp. M cars before 1994

MS Stock M cars, 1994–present
MM Modified M cars, 1994–present
MC ALL R-class MINI Cooper models
X ALL non-BMW or MINI models

G Gold Class for all Instructors, opt-in drivers, and cars with slick tires

Stock classes permit any size wheel and tire; non-stock shock absorbers, bushings and strut braces; any brake pad material (brakes must be stock-size), any air filter or cold air intake or cat-back exhaust; and naturally-aspirated cars may use aftermarket engine management software. Tires must be 140 treadwear rated or higher in Stock. ANY other performance modification, including but not limited to springs, "R"-compound tires, and engine software for turbocharged/supercharged cars, puts the car in Modified. Non-DOT tires (i.e. slicks) on any car place it in Gold Class. All cars must be under a 92 dB noise level to be driven at Qualcomm—and we'll be checking. Our car classes are kept simple so we can use the honor system.

Women drivers and Novices are classified based upon the car they are driving. We also award a Women's Class trophy to the woman with the fastest time, and two Novice trophies to the two fastest novices. This means women and novices will be eligible for multiple trophies. For example, a very fast novice could win a novice trophy and a trophy in his car class. Remember, you are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a trophy you are now a ringer, not a novice.

California's NEW Smog Check Law AB 2289

As a proud owner of a convertible E36, I often take advantage of the great weather we have here in California for which to enjoy top-down cruising along the coast and the mountain side; there's nothing like the feeling of fresh coastal or mountain air to enhance the driving experience. With millions of vehicles on the road, the environmentally conscious State of California strives to preserve this experience and curtail the spread of air pollution, in addition to other benefits, by requiring emission check of most vehicles on the road every two years. I often relate the uncomfortable experience of getting a smog check to an expectant father pacing up and down the maternity ward hoping, praying that everything would be okay. In January 1, 2013, a new California law went into effect that will help relieve some of the uneasiness we feel when getting a smog check.



The new law, AB 2289, which has already been in effect in 22 other states, will dramatically reduce the time and cost of smog checks. The previous system required that vehicles pass the following tests:

- 1. Tailpipe emissions test to measure pollutant output from the tailpipe
- 2. Visual inspection of emission components to ensure they are current and properly installed
- 3. Functional test to ensure that the various emission components are functioning properly
- 4. OBD II computer diagnostic check

Under AB 2289, the tailpipe emission test will no longer be required for model year 2000 and newer vehicles. The program will make use of the vehicle's own OBD II emissions monitoring system to determine harmful emissions production instead of measuring the output from the tailpipe.

The OBD II system – As of 1996, all vehicles imported into the United States are required to be equipped with an On-Board Diagnostics system referred to as OBD II. This computer-based system is designed to monitor the engine's emission conditions, gather data, and process collected information against pre-determined values for various input levels and performance patterns. If any variations from established normal values are found, the computer will alert the driver of an emissions problem, the "Check Engine" or "Engine Malfunction" light will illuminate on the dashboard.

The new law changes to the following smog inspection procedures and guidelines:

- 1. Use OBD II to expedite the smog check process
- 2. Vehicles with history of releasing large amounts of pollutants MUST test at stations with the highest performance ratings
- 3. Stiffer fines for improper inspections
- 4. Permit the state to contract with the private sector to manage franchise-like networks of independently owned Smog Check stations.
- Encourage community colleges and other training institutions to develop technician-training programs

In addition, AB2289 does away with Gold Shield station certification and replaces it with a STAR rated (Station and Technician reports) which provides a rating for every smog inspection done by a technician and compiles their scores to give an overall rating for the shop. Gross polluters will be directed to STAR stations with the highest rating.



Although this law will not directly affect my vehicle since my E36 was manufactured in 1997, it will indirectly help reduce my anxiety level; I'm hoping that there will be fewer customers in the Smog Check Station to witness me pacing around the waiting area.



TIRE TECH TALK

This month we will talk about the touchy subject that is run-flat tires. I know I have had this conversation with a few members and I hope to shed some more light on what makes a run-flat different. Recently J.D. Power released a study on OEM tires and found out that customers are getting increasingly frustrated by run-flats, here is a quote from their press release:

"Customers with vehicles equipped with run-flat tires are nearly twice as likely as those with vehicles equipped with standard tires to have to replace a tire due to a flat or blowout. Run-flat tires cannot be repaired and often need to be replaced in pairs rather than as a single tire." Read more here – http://goo.gl/Bbwik

Car and Driver recently released a great photo and description of the differences between a run-flat and standard tire. I have attached it so that you can see the differences. The run-flat tire is on the right in the picture.

Quite a few people don't care for the performance or ride of run-flat tires and manufacturers are stepping up to help out where they can. Michelin now offers the Michelin Promise Plan where with the purchase of a full set of tires you get 3-Years of Flat Tire Changing Assistance where a qualified service professional will change your flat and install your spare tire or provide towing at no charge up to 150 miles for free. Available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year in the U.S. and Canada.
