FEATURED MEMBER: MICHAEL HORNISHER

FASTER IS BETTER. . . By Michael Hornisher

With real estate it's all about location, location, location! With cars it's all about "the total package". If all the components don't look and work well together, you just won't buy that brand's package. BMW, Porsche, Ferrari and Lamborghini know this, and they each package their cars very carefully for their respective target markets.

Trying to evaluate these cars based only on statistics such as 0 to 60mph, curb weight or horsepower, tells you surprisingly little about each brand's total package. During a recent high performance driving event (HPDE), I got the opportunity to drive several of these cars on the Firebird East road course.

While precision timing was not possible without transponders, from my unofficial stopwatch lap times alone, it was apparent to me that variations in lap times had more to do with the driver's familiarity with the track and with the car's capabilities, than it did with the horsepower or torque ratings of the cars. I found that after ten laps in my familiar BMW e46, I could put up very comparable lap times to those I drove in a Lamborghini LP560, or a Ferrari F430 that I only drove for three or four laps!

So what is the cheapest way to set faster lap times? Drive more laps! It's as simple as that.





Oktoberfest 2013: Monterey, CA... Quentin Peterson

Last newsletter I went over how much goes into Oktoberfest each year and how important it is to prepare for this event. You can read the article at your leisure by the link to our chapter website (go to page 8): http://www.bmwccasonora.com/newsletters/2012fall.pdf

BMW CCA National has not yet opened registration for the event. Registration will begin in March, and once registered for Oktoberfest, you can reserve the hotel's group rate. A block of rooms has been reserved, as the club wanted to be sure that only those attending the event got the special rate. It's wise to reserve your room early in this case because they will probably fill up and then the alternative hotel sites simply aren't going to be as good a value as this one.

This summer will be the third straight that Julia and I have spent in Monterey. The first year, she drove her '07 MRoadster out and back. Last year, I drove out and back and picked her up at the San Francisco airport in my e30 M3. I have not grown tired of it, and I'm really looking forward to the drive out and back again this summer.

What is it about this location that calls to me? Especially in late July to mid-August, after two really hot months here in the Old Pueblo, I'm more than just a little ready to drive out of the desert, smell the ocean breezes, hear the surf roll in and travel with the sunroof open or the top down as the case may be. I think it's true for a number of reasons that, for most of us, 'getting there' is **NOT** 'half the fun'. Travel can be a task or it can be a simple pleasure, and my inner child isn't constantly carping "are we there yet?" while I'm motoring along certain sections of Pacific Coast Highway 1. I have to admit it, I'm more than a little smug to be driving or riding in something that can perform, down roads that were meant to be driven. And so, for me, having fun in a performance car, I really like to stretch out my time getting there.

There are a variety of ways to get to Monterey and back from Tucson. If it's a matter of time, the inland Interstate 101 between the California towns of Paso Robles and Monterey will allow you to get out and get back, quickly!!! The coastal highways are less travelled (with the exception of the interstate, at certain times, between Los Angeles and Santa Barbara), and they are great fun, if you like to drive on roads that are challenging. If I've got the time, I'm taking the Pacific Coast Highway 1 between Morro Bay and Monterey. On this stretch of road, there's an opportunity to stop and enjoy the ocean views at various spots, tour Hearst Castle at San Simeon, have some chili and cornbread at Big Sur, etc., before rolling in, in a relaxed frame of mind, to Monterey. I consider this stretch of roadway, taken at a leisurely pace (so I say now, at my leisure), to be one of the best times I've had on four wheels. And you will still get to Monterey in plenty of time. Last year, I packed up early morning from Morro Bay, travelled to the San Francisco Airport and picked up Julia mid-day, and from there, we drove to Monterey in plenty of time to check in mid-afternoon at The Portola Inn near Fisherman's Wharf in Monterey.

So once you are on Pacific Coast Highway 1 at Morro Bay, you're within a day's drive of Monterey and can take your time getting there. If you really have to beat it up or back quickly, you probably want to pick up the 101 that begins/ends at Paso Robles/Monterey. That's a pretty simple choice and it really is, for me, just a matter of how much time I have. Getting to Morro Bay from Tucson is more of a chore, and it can also be a case of poor timing and bad luck, but as with anything involving luck, there are ways to

improve your odds. The year before last I drove to Los Angeles via Phoenix on I-10, then stopped to rest in Santa Monica, but there's typically a lot of traffic to sort out, depending on the day and time of day, in just getting to Santa Monica from downtown LA, and that's on the interstate! Last year, I looked for an alternate route and I found an interesting two-lane highway up to and through a town called Julian, California. My plan worked because I got out of Tucson late in the day, my last-minute preparations being what they were. I made Yuma around 10pm and overnighted there (taking Interstate 8 west, like I'm going to San Diego). At the Descanso, California/Japatul Valley Road Exit 40, I took California Highway 79 to Julian, found gas and refilled the tank, had a great lunch and enjoyed the rest of the highway to the top of Mount Palomar, where I spent the night. Coming down the mountain the next morning, a line-up of M5 owners with a renegade Porsche owner were getting ready to take the road to the observatory gate. Had I been five minutes or more earlier or later, I would have missed them and been none the wiser. It was a really spirited ride to the top of the mountain! A great eye-opener, before I had my morning coffee. On the other side of the mountain there are casinos, hotels and bed and breakfasts, so this route is worth considering. But my getting through LA to Santa Barbara was more of a slog, because it was a mid-morning Saturday, and everyone else (it sure seemed like everyone else) was going to the beaches. That's just not fun, and a little bit of advance planning on my part would have avoided the lumbering, not-quite gridlock, *grind* of travelling slowly in the fast lane. Getting out to Monterey again this year will require some preparation, a fair amount of free time and some luck, as always. There's been some talk about getting a caravan together, but so far, it's just been talk...

Great BMW Apps for iOS, Android and Windows Mobile

Most of us have smartphones and an iPad or other tablet. For Apple products, my "BMW" search in the iOS App Store brought up no less than 284 iPad search results. There are LOTS of racing games here (drive your favorite virtual BMW). You can even be your favorite F1 driver for just 99 cents!!!

One of the games that caught my eye is a puzzle game called "Unblock my car for BMW" and you can't beat the price (it's free). The iOS Developers have also come up with lots of wallpaper apps and news magazines as well. BTW, Mini has not been left out and there are even BMW and Mini TV apps! And if you are planning a trip to Germany, German Talk Pad provides essential German phrases on one screen. And there are apps that will link you with various forums and even some dealerships. For iPhone, you can locate your newer vehicle (should you lose it in a parking lot) with "My BMW Remote". If you want to share your favorite drives, you can with "The Ultimate Drive". My personal favorite, however, is the "BMW M Power Meter", with which you can record the performance data for your driving. If you have an Apple Device, you want to be sure to look for the specific device you intend to use it on. I can tell you that iPhone apps look terrible on an iPad. The spacing and dimensions just don't come out right, if you mix up the device applications.

On the other hand, if you are using an Android device, you've got even more available apps – just now, I have brought up no less than 2291 results on an Android tablet. As it is for iOS, many of these are wallpapers and games. Most noteworthy seem to be "BMW Warning Lamps", which for \$2.99 will tell you what that indicator light means, "BMW Encyclopedia", a free app that provides a photo and video gallery along with every model made by BMW from the Series 1 – Z8 (according to the developer), and there's a "BMW Fault Codes" app which provides DTC Codes from 1996 and newer models. I should mention that there are several apps which perform similar functions, in addition to these Android apps I have mentioned. One of the cooler ones is "Send to Car" which lets you send an address from Google Maps directly to your car's navigation system (if you have one). Since I don't, I haven't been able to test it out. And if you have a teenager in the house, don't overlook "Learn to Park" (a free app), which puts you at the wheel of a Mini

Last, and certainly least at this point in time, a few developers have apps in the Microsoft apps stores for Windows Mobile (32 apps only) and for Windows 8 tablets (1). All the apps are either themes or links to BMW related sites or blogs. Dismal. But not wanting to leave on a negative note, unless you have Windows, you have lots to choose from!
