#### The Club Loses a Long-Time Friend Stanley "Iceman" Jackson Passes Away at 79

White Mountain Chapter friends and colleagues, on Friday, April 8th, 2011 at 12:55pm, our Dad, Stanley "Iceman" Jackson, Member #1777, the Boston Chapter BMW CCA Ice Racing Chairman (held on Newfound Lake, N.H.), possessor of an unbelievable, and usually unbeatable, talent for Ice Racing, retired High Performance Driving School Instructor, master on the Autocross course, and Oktoberfest Rally champion, passed away at 79 years old. Many of you know how strong and healthy he was, so you will understand how completely unexpected and shocking this loss was to us.

The first sign that anything could even conceivably be wrong came on Friday, March 18th, when he passed out while snowshoeing out a trail on one of his properties. On Monday, March 28th, Stanley Jackson Sr. underwent emergency heart surgery to perform a single bypass, after suffering cardiac arrest twice in the hospital. On Tuesday we were given little hope – but by Wednesday he had started to fight back – and by Thursday it appeared that things might really be turning around. However, he remained unconscious on full life and heart support for over ten days. His mind and body fought incredibly hard, but the damage that had occurred to his heart and the detrimental complications to the body as a result of the heart and life support machines were just too much even for the Iceman – on April 8th he passed peacefully with family at each side – yesterday he was laid to rest. He had so much left to live for, but he had also lived for so much.

We ask that you all share this sad news with everyone that knew our father.

A memorial service and celebration of his life was held on Saturday, May 7th at the Union Congregational Church in Hebron, N.H.. In lieu of flowers, donations in the name of Stanley "Iceman" Jackson would be appreciated to any of the following organizations:



#### **Replacing A Weather-Beaten Windshield Cowl on Late-Model BMWs** It's Actually Easier Than You Might Think

Introduction: As a card carrying member of the BMW CCA, you most likely are a regular recipient of the Bavarian Autosport catalog. And if you've thumbed through its pages over the past few years, then you're surely familiar with the funny little "German looking" guy, Otto. Otto is Bavarian Autosport's resident "Answer Man" and has been addressing BMW owners' tech questions for many years now. Always eager to share his BMW wisdom with other fellow BMW owners, Otto wanted a while back to start a regular column in the Profile; glad to see he's back. - ed.

Many of the later model BMWs (E36, E46, E90/91/92/93, E39, E60/61, E38, E65/66, E6364, etc.) have a plastic cowl trim at the base of the windshield. The trim piece has a molded-in rubber lip that seals to the bottom of the windshield this helps to keep excess water out of the wiper linkage and climate control air inlet area. Typically, the rubber lip will start to crack or curl up and will no longer seal to the windshield. Additionally, the cover itself may start to pull up in the corners.

The cowl trim panel is relatively easy to replace. Here is the procedure for the E46 models (3-Series '99-'05):

• Remove the wiper arm assemblies. Before removing the wiper arms take note of how they are positioned on the windshield and against the stops on the cowl trim panel. Pry off the trim caps covering the nuts that secure the wiper arms to the shafts. Remove the nuts. Use the wiper arm puller tool to remove the wiper arms from the shafts (detailed in the E46 Bentley repair manual). See figures 2-3.

Remove the cowl trim panel. The trim is secured via a few push clips on the back of the panel (look at your new trim panel to see the specific locations). Use a non-marring pry tool to pry the trim panel up and off of the cowl area. Note that the hood seals overlap the panel at the outer areas.

**6** Install the new trim panel. See figure 1. Note how the panel has locating tabs along the lower (forward) edge. Make sure to insert these first, then lower the panel into place and gently tap the panel down in the locations of the white clips to secure them.

• Replace the wiper arms. Position the wiper arms in the proper parking locations and install the securing nuts. Replace the nut trim caps.

#### The Man Behind the Mask Gordon Arnold

Gordon grew up in the Motor City (Detroit). In fact, his first real job was on the engine assembly line at Ford's original manufacturing plant. 


