# Member Spotlight This Edition: Mark and MB Francoeur





As simple as the events of that Saturday seemed to most participants, it was really due to the good planning of the host Viper Club months in advance. The goal this year was to surpass the 300 car attendance of 2010. This goal was exceeded with help of clubs like the BMW CCA. While the White Mountain Chapter played a central part in the planning and organization of the event, club members from MA, VT, RI and ME were in attendance. Thanks goes out to all old and new friends who brought their own personal piece of the BMW family to be displayed.

While everyone brought something to the show, some took away some well earned hardware. The most noticeable BMW attraction on the green was the 1972, Model 2002 of Roy Wicklund from Petersham, MA. It was hard to miss with bright orange paint shining in the sun! The closer your came to the sporty little car, the more impressed you had to be. This was not your father's 2002. A full chassis-off restoration and hand built turbo body kit gave the car a fresh look. Under the hood was a well placed S14 engine originally made for the mighty E30 M3 of the 1980s. Recaro sport seats in cloth set off the interior which was flawless. The judges decided the four and a half years of hard work to make this piece of road art deserved first place in class.

Second place went to Dan Kerman of Atkinson, NH and his 2002, M3. While most of us are struck by how perfect an M3 is right out of Munich. Dan showed us how "more perfect" they can become. Most every car show fan has seen what Dinan parts can do for a car. This car had its share where it

counts for speed. The real surprise of this car was the fiberglass work under the brilliant red paint. Hood, trunk, and both bumpers were custom made by Dan and were unique and seamlessly integrated with the original sheet metal. No easy task, but I now know it can be done given enough motivation and maybe some OCD. Truly a "labor of love" as Dan freely admits.

Other offerings from the blue with white clan included a wide mix of cars spanning 1960 to 2011. Some were modified to the max, others perfectly preserved. Seven series, five series, SAVs, Z3s, M series, and many more models were covered. There were too many to mention here, but a note of gratitude goes out to all participants.

I cannot begin to cover the rest of the show in this column. Let's just say if you are a fan of additional wonder cars, you would not be disappointed. Vipers and Corvettes gathered along with other American icons. Japan was represented by Datsun / Nissan and Toyotas. Porsches, Maseratis, Audis, Lamborghinis, and Mercedes were to be seen in large numbers as well.

The best-in-show (and maybe all of the New England) was a 1957 Ferrari 166mm Milli Miglia race car. The then state-of-the-art car is powered by a 12 cylinder sub 2 liter engine. The light weight car could fly along well over 100 mph. It's hard to imagine racing down country roads at speed in a car devoid of a roll bar, crumple zone, or anything more than aluminum side panels for protection. For that very reason most of the cars from this era were crushed, along with their drivers. Existing examples from this time are rare and this one is estimated to be worth \$5 Million!

This article only briefly conveys the events of Aug 20th at the Anheuser-Busch Brewery and the fun had by all. Next year, mark you calendars to attend with or without your favorite four wheeled companion and see for yourself.

# Manual Transmission Problem Popping Out of Gear

tto often receives requests for help with a manual transmission that pops out of gear. This most commonly happens when power is applied, or may be so bad that any attempt to drive in the affected gear will cause the shifter to violently snap out of gear. This certainly would not be a clutch problem, nor is it likely a shifter problem. For the shifter to be the cause, it would have to be extremely worn, actually to the point of hitting the console to prevent it from moving far enough to fully engage the "gears" in the transmission. The most common cause for the transmission popping out of gear (any gear) would be a worn guide sleeve and the corresponding shift fork.

The guide sleeves are the units that move on the transmission gear shafts to engage the synchronizers and lock in the selected gears. The sleeves look like gears but have no teeth on the outer surface. Instead they have a groove cut around the outside. A U-shaped fork fits into the groove and the fork is operated by the shifting rods, moving forward and back to move the guide sleeves. With age, the forks and the grooves in the sleeves will wear. If enough wear occurs, the sleeves will not fully lock the synchronizers into the gears, resulting in the selected gear "popping out". The sleeves and forks will experience accelerated wear due to dirty fluid (not changed often enough), low fluid, incorrect fluid and overheating. Here is a perfect case for regular fluid changes, using synthetic fluid and installing a high-power magnetic drain plug.

The straightforward repair for this problem is simply to replace the offending guide sleeve and its shift fork. While this certainly can be done, these parts are moderately expensive and there is likely other wear that should be addressed if the transmission is already going to be opened up, such as other guide sleeves and forks, the synchronizers, bearings, etc.

Bavarian Autosport (www.bavauto.com or 800-535-2002) can order any, and all, of the parts required to rebuild your transmission. You would need the applicable guide sleeve, shift fork and the gaskets and seals - as a minimum. As noted above, a full inspection should be done as to the condition of the synchronizers, bearings, etc.




