Real Men Don't Read Manuals

Introduction: As a regular reader of the Profile, you've noticed over the past months many articles written by David Harrison for the impressions from the winding road column, which is a general "catch all" column for anyone who has an interesting anecdote or experience worth sharing. Because of his expressed interest in continuing to write for the Profile on a regular basis, it was decided his writings deserved two new columns of their own. Insight from the rear view mirror will be all encompassing musings from David's past and ongoing automotive experiences and the knucklebuster (a term commonly used by U.S. Air Force mechanics - for obvious reasons) will focus more on articles of a tech nature. Hats off to David for his continuing creative enthusiasm! - ed.

Have you read any good manuals lately; those printed gems of information for your BMW? There are quite a few out there and I can recommend some exciting reading. Well, at least some insightful reading.

The most important manual you can study for your vehicle is the one that comes with the car. The "Owners Manual for Vehicle" is a must read for any new owner. Don't give me that old excuse that real men (and women) don't read manuals or instructions. Yes they do, if they know what is good for them! Reading the manual is the only way to find out what you do not know about your car. Make sure you have one for every car and for God's sake store it in the vehicle where you may need it most. There should be a law requiring everyone to maintain a copy of the owner's manual in every car. At a traffic stop the police should ask to see your driver's license, registration, and owner's manual. This would avoid motorist not having a clue as to how to change a tire, program the radio, or even open the hood. It's all in the manual! You paid for it when you bought the car. Just use it.

So you read the Owner's Manual when you first brought the car home? Outstanding, keep re-reading your manual once in a while. I still find myself looking through the manual of a 525i that I have owned for over ten years. Every accessory's location and operation will never be fully committed to my memory (I reset the clock twice a year and have a 50/50 chance of doing it without the manual). On the E34 there is also a complex ritual for setting the intermittent wiper speeds that defies all intuition. The whole sequence involves toggling the wiper control on, then off, holding it just right for a few seconds then resuming the power. If I do not adjust the wipers for months I tend to forget how the insane procedure works. Luckily I have the manual to reference whenever needed. Thank goodness every car I have owned since then has a simple switch to set the wipers.

If you plan to do any work on your BMW you should have a maintenance manual(s). I strongly believe

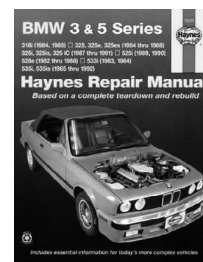
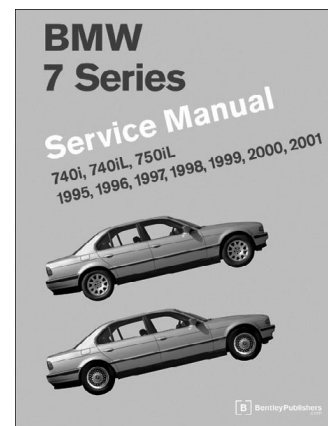
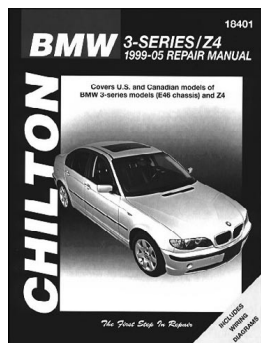
manuals let you know what you do not know and will help you remember the small details

you should not try to work on your car without a reference guide. This probably goes back to my Air Force training where you literally could not even touch an airplane unless you had a manual to reference. Again, the manual lets you know what you do not know and will help you remember the small details. Haynes and Chilton publish very affordable repair manuals covering some of the basics and can be found at most parts stores or Amazon. Bentley Publishers in Cambridge, Mass. is the best commercial provider of references for the amateur mechanic with their service manuals.

You can pretty well take almost any BMW apart and put it back together with Bentley books. My only complaint is that they call for the use of specialized BMW tools rather than referring to something I can buy from Sears or Snap-On.

Another obscure source of information you may locate is a factory shop manual which has found its way from a dealer's garage to sites like ebay. The problem with these manuals is the authors assume you have been trained by BMW to use their system. I have all these manuals and the Bentley is the one with all the greasy fingerprints on the cover. The others books are for confirming or enhancing the information in the Bentley.

Of course there is a wealth of online information, bulletin boards, YouTube, and blogs. These are great sources and you can definitely pick up some helpful hints and tricks. While these sources are useful, I have found conflicting and just plain wrong information at times. Any advise from the general public can be suspect. Hence, I search for people's comments online, watch the videos, and then confirm the information with the Bentley. Of course the tech lines to BMW CCA vendors like Bavarian Auto, Car Guys, or even a sympathetic repair shop can be a source of valuable information as well. So get your hands on a manual or few and get the most out of your BMW.



Whether you're an armchair-, shade tree- or professional-mechanic, or simply a basic operator of your BMW, manuals truly are indispensable.

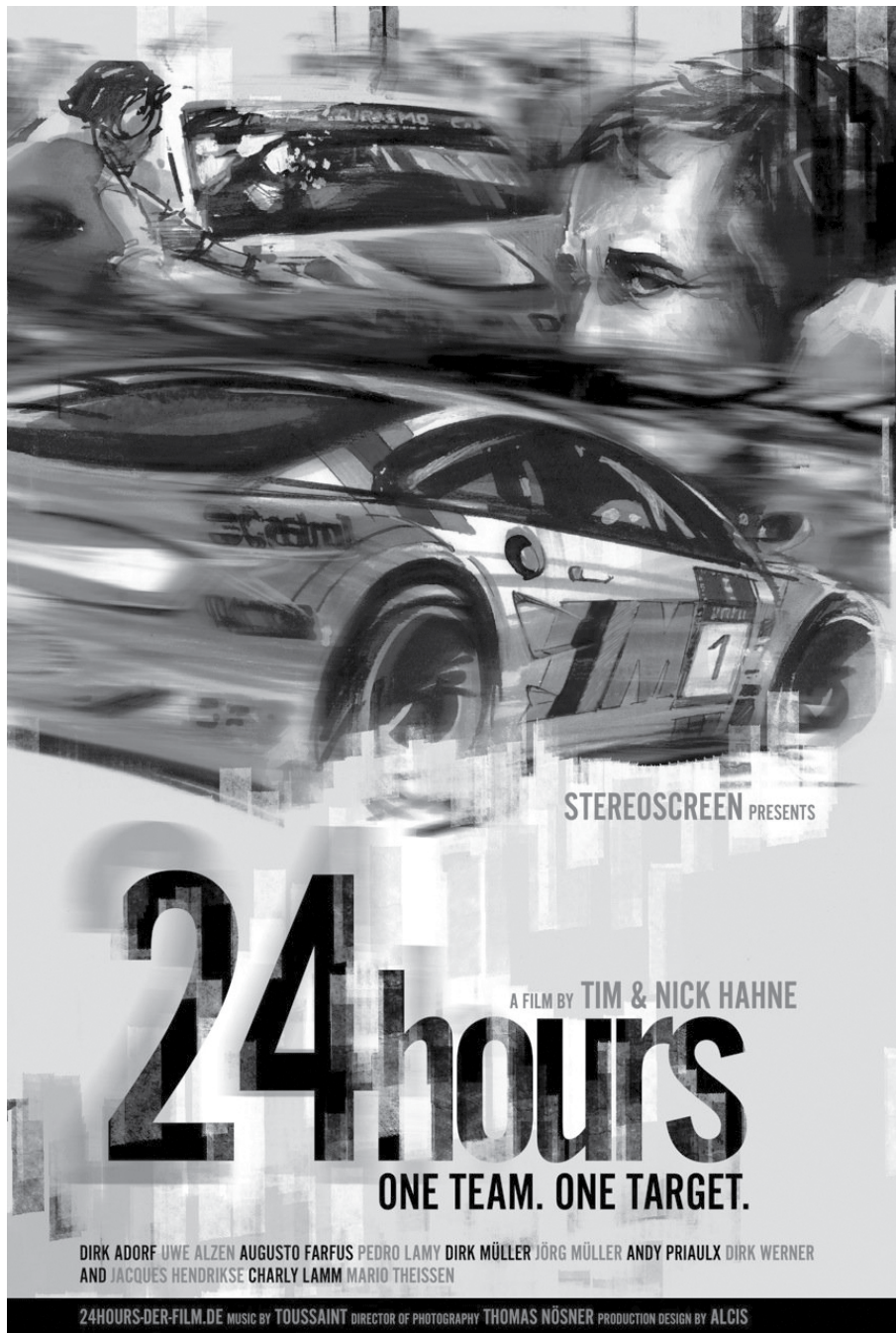

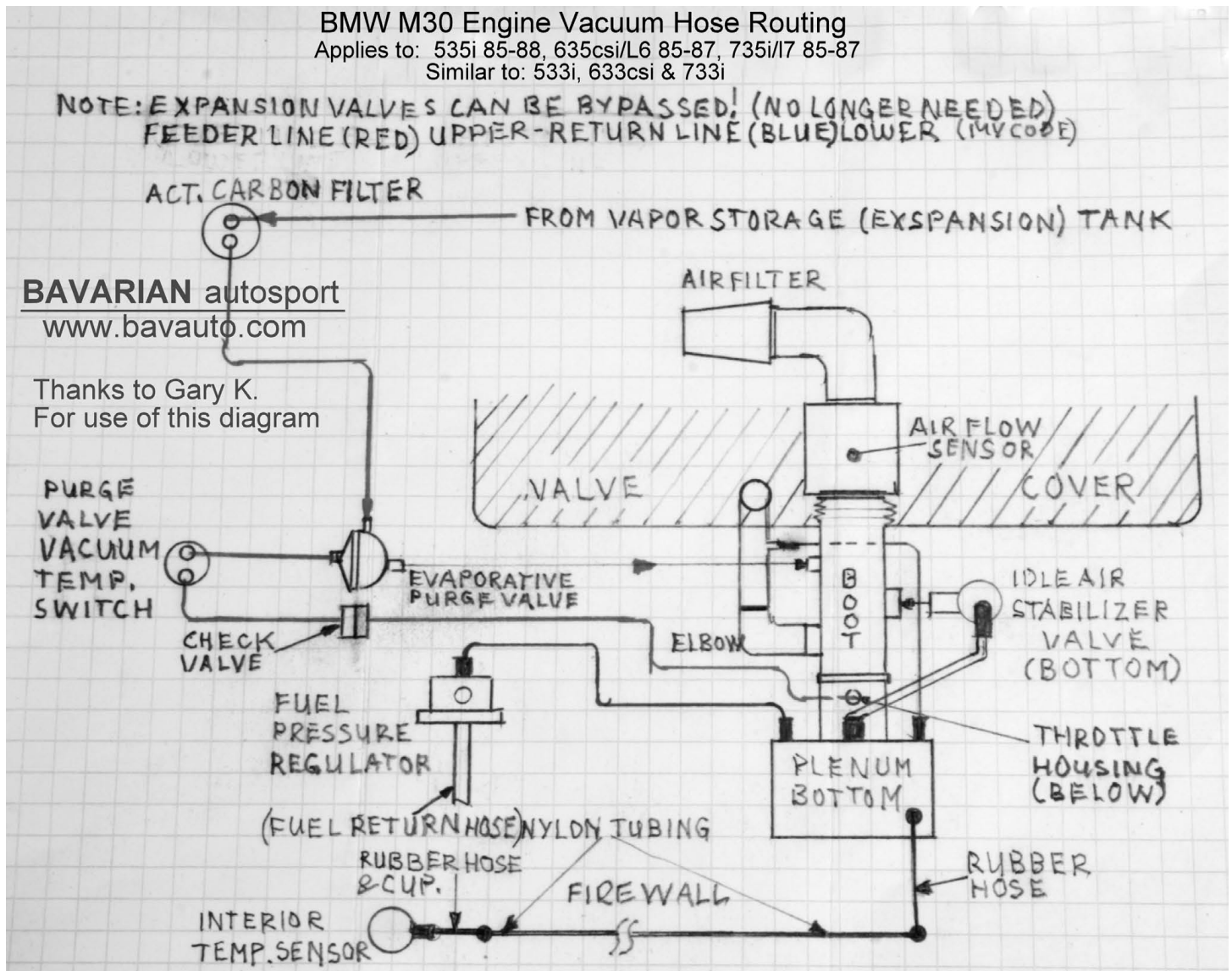
