PRESIDENT'S CORNER


Hello and Greetings to my fellow Bimmerphiles,

This home and museum room are decorated with much of the original furniture of the Keller family. Of particular note is her complete library of Braille books and her original Braille typewriter. The entire estate is nestled under a cooling canopy of English boxwoods (over 150 years old), many varieties of plants, and an abundance of English Ivy (for which the estate receives its name, Green Ivy).

MARCH 23: Jack Daniels Run with lunch at Miss Mary Bobo's

We've been going on this fun run for more than a decade because it's so much fun. The people at Miss Mary Bobo's and Jack Daniels Distillery are always in full Southern character. The food is really good too. We also stop at Falls Mill, a country store with an operating water wheel along the way.

TAKING A TRIP WITH THE BMW CLUB

You may have noticed that a lot of our club events are trips to points of interest around Alabama, and sometimes surrounding states. As a club, we've logged a lot of miles over the past decade or so. Usually these trips begin from a starting point in Decatur or Birmingham at around 9:00 am on a Saturday morning. DEEP THOUGHTS ABOUT GPS AND MY WONKY BMW SPEEDOMETER

B y no means am I a GPS expert but started wonder about how accurate is my Garmin GPS when it comes to predicting my forward velocity. The speedometer in the Bimmer has always been overly optimistic when it comes to speed so I wanted to use the GPS to come up with a calibration curve. Before making any decisions it would be necessary to do a bit of GPS research and here is a quick synopsis of what was found.

GPS uses 24 space-bound satellites in geosynchronous orbit. The satellites know exactly where they are and with the extreme accuracy of their onboard atomic clocks any ground based GPS received can determine your exact location and speed. So, using your GPS receive as an absolute standard for determining speed is perfectly acceptable provide the receiver can see four satellites. Three satellites will give you exact positioning but with four you get your altitude to boot. The forth satellite also provides the GPS received a back-up calculation to improve the determination of your location.

So, let say you want to check the accuracy of your Bimmer speedometer. Find a very long stretch of road with few trees or buildings that might cause a signal to bounce. Check to see if the GPS showing your altitude as that tells you it has a lock on four satellites and you are ready to run your test. In my case, I found the speedometer is off about 5 mph at 70 mph (it reads 75).

FYI, if the GPS system did not compensate for the time dilation predicted by Einstein's theory of relativity you'd be off by almost 9 miles in positioning.
