The neat part of the cars is that they are all driven! No garage queens and museum cars here. Jay appears daily and takes several of the cars out for drives lasting many hours. There were well over 100 cars and likely 50 motorcycles. The motorcycles ranged from conventional powered bikes to steam and turbine powered examples. Even Elvis Presley's Harley was there. The collection just seemed to be endless — Duesenberg, Cadillacs, Pontiacs, Cosmos, the Chrysler Turbine car with a spare power train, fire engines, fuel trucks, a model 600 Datsun, Pierce-Arrows, and on and on.

And to boot, Jay has commissioned local artists to recreate the advertisements of the day. They are situated on the walls behind the cars and are about 20x30 feet in size! Some even have a tongue in cheek image of Jay in them. The place is dotted with models and memorabilia of the era as well. He even has a fully functioning steam generator that was taken from a large city, refurbished, installed and is fully operational. It almost seems like his goal is to retain a bit of the past in the transportation industry for future generations.

We finished up the tour in the fabrication shop. What a shop! This is where 10-12 craftsmen do everything from engine rebuilds to complete fabrication of car bodies using English Wheels and hammer and dolly. It is by far the cleanest, most well organized working shop I have ever seen. And the equipment is beyond belief. As we were wrapping up with Bob nearly three hours after we started, who should wander up to see us other than Jay Leno! Not just a casual "Hello" but a dialogue of where we were from, our interests and how we got to see his collection. It lasted nearly 45 minutes. He spent time going over some of his creations, which were underway, and the new 3D printing technology he was using to make parts that are not otherwise obtainable. To say all of us were overwhelmed would be an understatement. He was just a regular car guy talking to car folks about cars.

A High Desert Climax

But my bucket list week was just beginning. On Tuesday, I and another of our Leno attendees drove to Pahrump, NV, over a mountain or two past Death Valley. What is in Pahrump, you might ask? Originally the brothel for those that could not afford the Las Vegas strip (pun intended), Pahrump has become the home of Spring Mountain Motor Resort and Country Club. I had visited the track over 10 years ago when it was an isolated track with a couple of temporary tents in the middle of the high desert owned by an entertaining Englishman. Lots can change in a decade. The Englishman has moved on and the new owner has constructed something unique. Now it is 6.1 miles of various configurations of track. The longest track in North America. But it doesn't stop there. In addition to one of the largest skid pads I have ever seen, there is a clubhouse with a sauna, hot tub, game room and large dining area. There are classrooms for the Corvette and Cadillac schools. Elsewhere on the 600 acres is a man-made lake with jet packs, an island, racquetball courts and an indoor shooting range. There are endless private garages and luxury condos. The plan is to purchase additional land and build 16 miles of road racing circuit — the largest in the world with a jet landing strip and helipad. There even are housing plans in the works.

Our first day (Wednesday), they opened the 1.5 mile section of the track just for us! Our own play area for four people. Some 11 turns in a mile and a half — it makes Blackhawk Farms seem relaxing. Then on Thursday and Friday they opened the Mansell Course, which expanded the course to about three miles. This time there were open- and closed-wheel cars since there was a race weekend coming up. We got to drive on Thursday and Friday, as well as view the first race. I estimate that I drove at least 250 track miles over the three days. On Saturday there was another race, which we got to see. Since we had some free time on one of the afternoons, we went four-wheeling into the mountains that surround Pahrump. Hard to believe 30 minutes from the 70 degree weather and we were in over a foot of snow. The views were breathtaking and the land seemed endless. Saturday afternoon I boarded a plane to come back to reality. My Bucket Week was over, but the memories will linger for a very long time.
