he San Diego Chapter is returning to the world-class BMW Performance Center West in nearby Thermal (Palm Springs area). This program has always sold out quickly because it includes nearly non-stop driving excitement in new M cars and other fun BMW models. Suitable for any experience-level driver, we will pair up two drivers per car and use most of the facility for these events:

- Hot laps in M cars around the 1.3 mile North Palm circuit led by an Instructor. Loaner helmets will be available; or bring your own Snell 2010 or later helmet if you have one
- "Performance Drive" with several laps on an autocross-style course
- · Skidpad "rat race" driving competition around a slick skidpad
- M3 autocross competition with practice, plus several timed runs
- M car Drag Race "down and back" to experience both maximum acceleration and braking
- Cars will include the M3 and M4 Competition Package, M5, M6 Gran Coupe, M240i, 340i
- We will conclude with Hot Lap rides with an Instructor drifting around the track

Sound like fun? The format enables us to flow from event to event, so you can choose the order and how many runs at each one (please be fair and wait your turn). Our program includes lunch, with gourmet sandwiches, salads, cookies and beverages. BMW's brandnew Performance Center building will be open by then; we will be some of the first to see it.

**DETAILS:** We can only accommodate the first 100 members who register. The Performance Center will use over 60 cars at the various events to give us plenty of track time while there, with two drivers per car alternating for equal seat time. You must be a BMW CCA member to participate.

The BMW CCA entry fee is \$220 per driver. Registration starts November 1 on MotorsportReg.

The program begins with lunch at 12:00. Please leave home early enough to arrive by 11:30. The gate has controlled entry, so you'll need to allow for time to sign in. During lunch, an orientation to the day's events will be provided.





## Women's Car Control & Autocross Clinic

On Saturday, October 15, San Diego Chapter volunteers, along with driving instructors from both the San Diego and Los Angeles chapters, met with a group of 30 women in the large west lot of Qualcomm Stadium for the first Women's Car Control and Autocross Clinic.



The day-long event consisted of a classroom session, driving exercises, a Q&A session and autocross practice. To begin the day, each car went through a quick technical inspection to ensure the car was safe for the day's activities. After the requisite coffee and muffins, the ladies were off to

the classroom where Robyn McNutt discussed a range of topics including proper seating and hand positions, late-apexing, understeer and oversteer, weight transfer, and the various methods of braking.

Next, attendees were broken into four groups. Each group cycled through the four driving

exercises: a decreasing-radius turn, threshold braking, a simulated emergency lane-change, and a slalom. At the decreasing-radius corner, drivers approached 45 mph as they entered the exercise. Then they would smoothly apply the brake, find the correct cornering speed and accelerate out. The

exercise taught trail braking, corner balance, traction management, and the importance of looking



far ahead. For the braking exercise, drivers would approach 40 mph and then fully apply the brakes.



For the first few runs, drivers would brake hard to learn what it feels like when ABS engages. The goal for subsequent runs was to work on threshold braking without engaging ABS. At the emergency lane change exercise, drivers would again approach 40 mph and at the last second, the instructor would call out a direction for the lane change. The exercise taught split-second decision making, fast and smooth inputs and emergency braking. The final exercise was the slalom which taught fast inputs, throttle balance and brake management.



The atmosphere at the event was very supportive and fun.
The instructors were honestly concerned about making sure we were learning – without being too intense.

After the exercises, we needed to refuel – lunch time! While we enjoyed the delicious lunch of bratwurst, grilled veggies and homemade potato salad catered by owner

Roger Browning of Flying Pig Pub & Kitchen, magic happened out in the parking lot as the exercises were connected to make an autocross course. After lunch, we had a Q & A session followed by a short drivers' meeting and then the fun began. It was finally time for autocross practice! Each attendee had 35

minutes on course, with an instructor, to put to use all the knowledge and experience gained from the classroom session and exercises. (If you're an autocrosser, you know that 35 minutes of autocross practice for \$50 is an amazing deal.) While we did have the timing clock set up for the driver to see, we didn't count cones and

we didn't record times as this wasn't a competitive autocross; instead, we focused on gradual improvements, having fun, and being safe. As an organizer, it was great to see those moments when things started to "click" for drivers – the moment when the rhythm of the slalom made sense or when

a late-apexed turn led to a fast exit speed. I saw a lot of smiles and heard a lot of laughing during autocross practice; I'm going to

the ladies were having fun.

Everything that the attendees experienced during the day – the classroom session, the exercises and the autocross – all contained concepts and skills which can be directly applicable to daily driving. The participants weren't the only ones learning something on Saturday; we organizers did, too. This was the first event of its type that we've done as a chapter. We identified areas where we can expand the

curriculum and improve some logistics. Importantly, we learned a lot about our attendees and their reasons for participating in this specific event. We asked the question, "What factors drew you to a women-only driving event and what concerns might prevent you from attending a regular (co-ed) car control clinic, autocross or HPDE?" We received numerous responses and most of them boiled down to feeling less intimidated, more comfortable and more supported at a women's event. One participant wrote, "... I was happy that the event was women-only. Women have a tendency to cheer each other on, be more comfortable asking questions in a woman-only setting, and don't see competition as

the end goal. I was there to learn better car control – not race against the clock." Many said that they would not have signed up for this type of driving event if it had been a mixed event, rather than for women only. It was quite encouraging to find out that a few

participants, who have been autocrossing for years, attended the event primarily to support the effort

to bring more women into motorsports. One woman wrote, "I love the fact that we are doing more things to encourage women to come out and give autocross a try and I wanted to fully support this effort."

We couldn't be more pleased that we

were able to host this event. It took the efforts of numerous dedicated individuals coming

The instructors were all great. I learned something different from each one. I now consciously grab only the outside of my steering wheel, I look through my turns, and I look for the Apex on freeway on-ramps... I'm also pretty confident in my car and what it is capable of.



We have only two autocrosses left this year, so gear up for our Penultimate Autocross in the Southeast Lot of Qualcomm!

Since we'll be back on Standard Time, we are limited to 80 participants – another reason to register early!

### IMPORTANT:

- Snell 2005 helmets will NOT be allowed after Dec 31 of this vear!
- All cars MUST be under a 87 dB noise level and we'll be checking! Over 87 dB = no autocross.
- We do run if it's raining—you'll learn more and your tires will wear less!
- You must be a BMW CCA member to participate.
   Join online at www.bmwcca.org in advance. Bring your membership card or print your membership confirmation if you have not yet received your membership card.
- We usually fill all the spots prior to the event, so register online early.
- If you choose to register onsite, bring cash or check and arrive by 7:30 am.
- The entry fee of \$65 includes breakfast items, lunch and beverages. Additional lunches for guests can be purchased for \$8 at Registration.



### Schedule:

6:30 am - Gates Open

7:00 am – Registration and Tech Inspection Open

8:00 am – Tech Inspection Closes (no inspection = no autocross)

8:20 am – Driver Meeting (mandatory)

9:00 am - Course Opens

The day typically ends between 4 – 4:30 pm.

## When you arrive:

- If you registered online, stop at the Gate to show your BMW CCA membership card, sign the waiver, receive your wrist band and receive your Tech Card.
- If you did not register online, you will receive a numbered card at Gate in order of arrival; take it to the Registration table after you go through Tech. Walk-up spots are not guaranteed.

- 3. Empty all loose items from your car and fill out the participant portion of the Tech Card. Bring your car and Tech Card to the Tech Line. If you pass Tech, you will receive a tech sticker and a run group sticker.
- 4. Take your Tech Card to Registration. You will receive car numbers to place on your side windows.
- 5. If you don't have a helmet, you can rent one at the Timing Trailer for \$10.

### **Newcomers:**

We've all had a first time and we're all still learning, so relax, have fun and enjoy your time with us. You will have an instructor take you around the course for one lap in your car showing you turn-in points, braking zones and so on. Your instructor will then ride with you for your next three laps helping you learn the course. In your next session, and during the timed runs, you can have an instructor with you or you can go solo if your instructor feels you're ready. These events are what you make them; you can push for good lap times and enjoy the friendly competition or you can have more of a social event where running laps is just another part of a fun-filled day.

- LC ALL BMWs through Model Year 1988; E30s through Model Year 1986; all naturally-aspirated 4-cylinder models-Stock or Modified
- NAS ALL naturally-aspirated, non M BMWs not in Legacy Class-Stock, and i3
- NAM ALL naturally-aspirated, non M BMWs not in Legacy Class-Modified
- **TS** ALL turbocharged BMWs (4-6-8-12 cyl, gas or diesel)-Stock
- TM ALL turbocharged BMWs (4-6-8-12 cyl, gas or diesel)-Modified
- MS ALL M cars under 400 factory hp-Stock
- MM ALL M cars under 400 factory hp-Modified
- MPS ALL M cars over 400 factory hp-Stock
- MPM ALL M cars over 400 factory hp-Modified
- MC ALL R-class MINI Cooper models (Stock or Modified)
- X ALL non-BMWs, or Austin Mini models
- G ALL Instructors OR experienced drivers who choose Gold Class AND drivers running non-DOT tires (i.e. slicks)
- \* Classification for specific cars is at the discretion of the Autocross Director

**ONLY Alterations Permitted in Stock Classes:** 

- ANY size wheel and tires. Tires must have DOT treadwear rating of 140 or higher
- ANY shock absorber using stock mounting and ANY suspension bushing material
- ANY air filter or air intake AHEAD OF mass airflow meter
- Non-stock software/firmware is permitted on naturallyaspirated engines only
- ANY brake pad material is allowed with Stock-size brake components
- Catalyst-back exhaust systems and strut tower braces are permitted

ANY other alterations move to Modified Classes, including:

- Tires with DOT treadwear rating under 140
- Non-stock springs, coilover suspensions, non-stock antiroll bars
- Software/firmware alterations to turbocharged/ supercharged engines
- Non-stock mass airflow meters, camshafts, downpipes, removed catalytic converter
- Non-stock-size brake rotors or calipers (stock-size replacements OK in Stock)

Women drivers and Novices are classified based upon the car they are driving. We award a Women's Class trophy to the woman with the fastest time, and two Novice trophies to the two fastest novices. This means women and novices will be eligible for multiple trophies. You are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a novice or class trophy you are no longer a novice.

- Provide positive motivation to all board members and chapter members.

## **VICE PRESIDENT**

- Attend board meetings and vote on issues as required.
- · Support the chapter president as required.
- Conduct board meetings in the absence of the chapter president.
- Act as Membership Chair by sending welcome letters to all new members.
- Answer numerous email inquiries concerning membership.

### **TREASURER**

- Attend board meetings and vote on issues as required.
- Reconcile accounts payable and receivable on a monthly basis.
- Present chapter financial status at monthly board meetings.
- Perform financial analysis for cash flow, income, and expenses.
- · Verify expenses and write reimbursement checks.
- Oversee the preparation of the annual tax return for the IRS.
- Prepare the Chapter Financial Report to national by March 31st of each calendar year.

## **SECRETARY**

Keep accurate minutes of each Board Meeting.

- Present the previous month's minutes to the Board for approval.
- Submit monthly minutes for publication in the newsletter and website.

### **DIRECTOR/AUTOCROSS**

- Attend board meetings and vote on issues as required.
- Negotiate stadium dates with the stadium officials and other car clubs.
- Arranging liability insurance for the events by submitting the insurance certificate request.
- Ensure that payment and insurance certificates are delivered to the stadium office.
- Arrange lunch, drink, and comfort facilities for the event
- Coordinate volunteers for course design, set-up, tech inspection, timing, registration, lunch, and clean-up.
- Coordinate with the Chief Instructor to ensure there are enough instructors for the event.
- Ensure the event is on schedule and supervise throughout the event.
- Coordinate procurement of trophies before the event and present them at the end of the event.
- Provide event information to newsletter editor and webmaster for publication.
- Manage email contact list and communicate with members about upcoming events to maximize attendance.
- Manage online registration, including timely updates to the registration website and generating reports of paid attendees.
- Report to the Board of Directors on the financial results and needs of the autocross program.

## **DIRECTOR/DRIVING SCHOOL**

- Attend board meetings and vote on issues as required.
- Plan all aspects of the driving school.
- Coordinate the volunteer staff for the annual driving school.
- Arrange liability insurance for the school by submitting the insurance certificate request.
- Coordinate with the motel to ensure rooms are reserved for instructors and students.
- Coordinate with the Chief Instructor to ensure there are enough instructors for the school.
- Coordinate with the Chief Steward for track supervision.
- Coordinate with the track officials for dates, track rental fees, corner workers, emergency medical

vehicle, and all necessary equipment.

- Oversee logistics for the chapter's equipment transport.
- Submit the Driving Events Reporting Form within 30 days of the driving school.

## **DIRECTOR/EQUIPMENT MEISTER**

- Attend board meetings and vote on issues as required.
- Maintain all aspects of Club truck, including arranging service/maintenance, insurance, registration, service records, storage location, washing, exercizing and fueling.
- Maintain Club trailer, lights, brakes, tires, hitch, and cover in good working order.
- Arrange suitable, secure trailer storage location.
- Maintain current inventory and value of trailer equipment, contents, and supplies.
- Maintain electronic equipment batteries, generator, PA system, radios, timing display, fire extinguishers, helmets, canopies, flags, vests, and other related autocross equipment.
- Maintain supply of wrist bands and insurance waiver forms.
- · Organize trailer equipment and loading plan.
- Transport club truck and trailer to and from each autocross event.
- Assist with set-up and teardown of equipment, helmet rentals/returns, packing/unpacking trailer at autocross events.
- Coordinate use of truck and trailer with Driving School Director for annual driving school.
- Transfer items not currently in use from trailer to club storage unit to open up space in trailer.

## **DIRECTOR/NEWSLETTER EDITOR**

- Attend board meetings and vote on issues as required.
- Write/edit material for newsletter.
- · Provide photos for the newsletter.
- Lay out submitted articles, ads, photos, etc. for each issue as required.
- Coordinate with the printer to ensure the newsletter is published eleven times per year.
- · Provide updated mailing lists to the printer.
- Provide newsletter in PDF format to chapter Webmeister and National BMW CCA website.

## **DIRECTOR/SOCIAL EVENTS**


