It was a really nice group of people to host and it seemed




YOUR CLUB NEEDS YOU!

Coronado Speed Festival

Hot Laps and Huge Smiles




The Coronado Speed Festival has become an institution in San Diego after 18 years. As part of Fleet Week, this is the only military base in the Western US opened to the public, and the only military runway turned into a temporary race track.

For several years, the BMW Dealer Association of San Diego has been a major sponsor of the Speed Festival, getting a lot of exposure by offering a Ride and Drive event with current BMW models, displaying the latest salivary stimulants from Bavaria (i8 and brand new 7-series among them), and giving the public \$1000 certificates toward a BMW purchase. The Association also arranged to bring the BMW USA Classic race car collection to Coronado, displaying the iconic CSL that launched BMW of North America, the ultra-rare E46 M3 GTR with its P60 V8 that was so fast it was later banned, and two E92 M3 GT2s that were champions in ALMS racing.

To entertain Military personnel, VIPs, and a few Club members with Hot Laps on track, the Association ordered a fleet of five M cars, all 4-door models by request: one M6 Gran Coupe, two M5s and two M3s. All had carbon ceramic brakes, and one had an MSRP of \$149K! They also provided an M6 Gran Coupe for Pace Car duty and an X5M for shuttling dignitaries. The five track cars were delivered to the Team of BMW CCA Hot Lap drivers more than two weeks in advance, to accumulate 1200 miles and have break in service performed. In past years, cars were either shipped to Coronado (and went on track with virtually zero miles) or delivered just a few days ahead so the Hot Lap drivers could put on a few hundred miles. We felt better about hammering M cars with some miles and fresh motor oil.





With a new sanctioning body this year, we were uncertain of when we might be able to take passengers on track. The schedule showed few openings. But course control was the same team that knew us from past years, and they squeezed



us on track between sessions whenever they could. That led to some last-minute riding opportunities and some unfortunate last-minute cancellations, but it was out of our hands. Some fighter pilot passengers thought their rides were as much fun as flying their F/A 18s! I'd trade them for a ride-along. The cars were amazingly quick and agile, with the 575 hp M5s showing slightly more acceleration, the lighter M3s being more tossable, and the M6 noticeably missing the Competition Package suspension. Our seven drivers rotated through all five cars, so we all got to sample the differences. Early Sunday morning, we had new front tires mounted, and since the same brand wasn't available, we also noticed some grip differences after the swap.



A special treat, as last year, was the M3 GT2s that joined us on track, with the passenger seat reserved for very special VIPs. BMW's Director of Corporate Communications,

Tom Plucinsky, piloted an M3 all three days. BMW racing legend Bill Auberlen flew in right after his United Sports Car win in Austin to take the second M3 on track Sunday. Their flat-crank V8s sounded amazing,



pleasing the crowd and putting indelible smiles on their lucky riders. Observers might have thought it strange that the stock M cars appeared to be keeping up with the race cars, at least



for a while. True enough, when each of us drove the lead car, we sometimes had to lift slightly before Turn 1 when we were sent out together. Is an M6 quicker than a full-race M3 GT2? Uh, no. These M3s are now part of BMW USA Classic's race car collection, which has the mission to "Present, Preserve and Protect" BMW's racing heritage. As such, the M3s had their power turned down and redlines lowered, ran on hard tires, and they used tall gearing that prevented the hole shot that launched the street cars like a carrier catapult. Our passengers loved feeling like we were matching the race cars' speed, but we drivers knew better.

The BMW Hot Laps will hopefully return next year, but that is not certain yet. The new SVRA sanctioning body has a national sponsorship arrangement with Jaguar, and indeed there was a nice Jaguar display, a public autocross course, and some F-Types on track Friday. They may step up and add the Hot Lap role next year, but we hope the BMW Dealer Association of San Diego continues to keep BMW front and center at the Coronado Speed Festival. Seven drivers are definitely ready to come back.

Thermal Club in October 2014, and several of us immediately began wondering how our Chapter could take advantage of having such a world-class facility so close to home. Some members visited as part of a press or *Roundel* event. But how about the rest of us?

Back in May, Chapter member (and good friend) Greg Uhler and his wife took a weekend getaway in Palm Springs, and while there, decided to see if they could visit the PCW. A facility tour was hastily arranged, including a walk-through in the

model homes for Thermal members. After mentioning their Club affiliation, their host offered to let them know of any openings in a future invitation-only sample driving event. Sure enough, the PCW had 4 spots a couple of weeks later, and Greg invited Lisa Goehring and me to join in



with just a few hour's notice to commit to a Sunday event. Sometimes, you have to know when to say yes! The four of us had a great time, and while still there, we began to explore how our Chapter could have an event open to all members. We learned of the menu of activities, planning details, potential dates, and got a price list. After a flurry of emails and phone calls, I was ready to propose the idea at our Board meeting just 2 days later. Many members were interested; some worried that we shouldn't commit to 100 participants we would have to pay for a month in advance. After some debate, we voted to pursue it. Quietly, I got commitments from Board members after the meeting to attend an upcoming invitation-only event; I had to give them a firm head count in a phone call after the meeting before the invitations might be offered to others.

After choosing September 27th for our event, we had a Fahren Affairs deadline coming up to get the word out. I had to scramble to get specific details together for a writeup, we decided how to handle payments (Jim Patterson will never volunteer to wrangle checks again!), and Connie Patterson quickly created the eye-catching graphic layout. The gestation from first speaking with the PCW to having an approved event ready for publication took just over one week. Whew!

There was an agonizing wait from the flurry of effort to create the event until Fahren Affairs would be in everyone's mailboxes. We put some hints out on Facebook, then decided to make an official announcement in an email blast timed with creating a Facebook event. Some of you may know that the September 27th event fully booked in just 3 days (including 14 people on a waiting list), with a few people hand-delivering checks to Jim's front door! Now we had a different problem: the event was sold out before most members would even learn about it in Fahren Affairs. After some discussion with Jim, I made some late-night calls to our PCW contact, checked their schedule and ours, and we added a second date for another 100 people on October 4th. After members saw the newsletter, the "overflow" event sold out in about 2 weeks. I think we're onto something here!

We have already scheduled future PCW events on January 30th, 2016 and January 28th, 2017 (both Saturdays). This is the weekend between the NFL playoffs and Super Bowl, a quiet weekend and ideal weather in the Coachella Valley. The format will evolve, and of course, BMW will have different cars for us to sample in future years. We will develop our registration process well in advance and announce it in Fahren Affairs. And no one will need to mail

checks to Jim Patterson.

BMW Performance Center West Event: A Participant's View by Chris Keefer

On a warm day in late September, 100 of our club members arrived at the BMW Performance Center West in Thermal, CA, a desert city nestled in the Coachella Valley. Dan Tackett and Jim Patterson organized the event at the newly opened facility which has become a fixture on the grounds of The Thermal Club - a private country club for racing enthusiasts with deep pockets. A visit to The BMW Performance Center is basically code for 'come out and beat up on brand new M cars.' We all met up at 9am, in 100 degree heat, to do just that.

After a brief meeting led by one of 12 driving instructors (including our own Brandon Watson), we were led out to the playground to enjoy five different driving events with a catered group lunch in between. The events consisted of a team rally race that resembled a mini gymkhana, a flat out drag race to a halting stop, a test of nerves and skill on a soaking wet skid pad, an Autocross, and a Lead/Follow exercise on the South Palm track at the club.

We started our day with a bit of competition. Two teams of ten navigated the relay event behind the wheel of the new M4. The relay involved speeding around a



section of the brand new autocross course, exiting the powerhouse and tagging off to the next team member. If you weren't clean in your driving or the hand-off to the next team member, you were heavily penalized. While our team was loaded with autocross veterans impressively pushing a Yas Marina M4 on course, our sloppy hand-offs would not net us a spot on the podium.

Next up was the drag strip which was loaded with an M5, M6, and M4. Our instructor had us line up in what felt like an illegal street drag from the 70s, but we weren't racing for pink slips, and the cops never showed. The end of the strip provided a unique challenge of getting the vehicle to stop in a designated 'stop box' which was slightly larger than the car itself. Fail to stop in the box came with a penalty. The brakes were impressive, as was the timing of the DCT transmissions that the cars were fitted with. Switching to manual mode typically netted you a second place finish, which illustrated how finely tuned these BMW M cars are.

Following our lead foot session we headed toward the skid pad, nicknamed "The Thunderdome." This was the skill challenge of the day as two 335i's squared off in a 'rat race' trying to catch each other's tail on the oval. The skid pad is like driving on ice as the polished concrete is continually soaked by an impressive sprinkler system. First time out, I spun the

335i about 720 degrees before I knew it. Second time out I impressed myself by not only winning the rat race round, but doing so mostly in full drift around the oval. Pure fun and a lesson in throttle modulation.

During lunch I'm absorbing the fact that I've driven almost every new M-car in BMW's lineup this hard without getting arrested. The moment I finish eating we're called to the timed Autocross course. The tight corners and short straights are a departure from our local club events with fast times coming in at under 30 seconds. Lucky for me, the cones are small and the judges didn't seem to be counting as I gave my best attempt to utilize the performance of the new F80 M3. The stop box was again in play, and managed to stay in it after a 28 second performance. My cheeks were starting to cramp from smiling, but the best was still to come.

I wasn't quite sure what to expect from the Lead/Follow exercise but I strap on my helmet and hop into a new M4. The instructor leads us on to the South Palm Track and talks us through the course via radio at a light pace, drawing the lines to take and what to expect from each turn. We approach the start after the warm up lap and things turn radically different. There is no feeling quite

like taking an M4 130mph down the straight, getting hard on the carbon ceramic brakes and having 400ft/ lbs of torque pull you through the apex. I was hooked. Lead/Follow, by far, was the highlight of the day for me. This alone was worth every penny of the modest price of admission to an incredible event hosted by our club.

In short, our trip to the BMW Performance Center West was amazing.
Imagine going into BMW Dealership armed with nothing but a few hundred bucks and your BMWCCA membership card and

asking a sales associate for the keys to 5 different M cars to beat on for the day. Should you attempt such a request, you'll probably be escorted off the lot and asked not to return. Yet, if you head to the BMW Performance Center West at Thermal, you'll be welcomed with open arms, encouraged to push your limits, and asked to return again and again for what is truly a unique and exhilarating experience.





Remember the sound limit at Qualcomm: all cars must be under a 92db noise level – we'll be checking!

Our sincerest thanks to BMW of El Cajon for their continued support of our Autocross Program!

Newcomers: We've all had a first time and we're all still learning, so relax, have fun, and enjoy your time with us. You will have an instructor take you around the course for one lap in your car showing you turn-in points, braking zones and so on. Your instructor will then ride with you for your next three laps helping you learn the course. In your next session, and the timed runs, you can have an instructor with you as much or as little as you want – whatever makes you comfortable. These events are what you make them; you can push for good lap times and enjoy the friendly competition or you can have more of a social event where running laps is just another part of a fun-filled day.

See the **Autocross Information Page** at http://www.sdbmwcca.com/autocross to get a better idea of how to prepare for this wonderfully addictive sport for your first time.

Note: We do run if it's raining – you'll learn more and your tires will wear less – so if you see some unusual drops of water falling from the sky, grab your raingear and head to the Q! Also, the helmet standard has changed to require Snell 2005 or 2010 ratings. Check yours now to be sure it's up to date – rentals are limited.

The entry fee is \$65, including breakfast items, lunch, and

beverages. You can pay online if you register in advance at http://sdbmwcca.motorsportreg.com, or with cash or check if you wait to register onsite. You must be a BMW CCA member to participate, and you can join online at www.bmwcca.org in advance. Please **print and bring your membership confirmation** if you have not yet received your BMW CCA membership card. We check membership of all participants at the gate.

REMEMBER: IF REGISTERED ONLINE, **BRING PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP** AND ARRIVE BY 7:30AM (BEFORE ON-SITE CUT-OFF) TO KEEP YOUR RESERVED SPOT

Gates will open at 6:30am; tech and registration will open at 7:00am. Tech will close at 8:20am and no cars will be inspected or allowed to run after this time. There is a **mandatory drivers meeting at 8:30am** and the course opens for runs at 9:00am.

When you arrive:

- 1. If you registered online, stop at the gate to sign the waiver and notify the Gate Greeter. Your name will be checked off the pre-registration list. All participants must show their BMW CCA membership card. Those who did not register online will receive a numbered card at the gate in their order of arrival; take it to the Registration table. There is no guarantee that spots will be available for those who wait to register the day of the event.
- 2. Empty all loose items from your car, then go through the Tech Line and have your car inspected. Bring your Tech card and you will receive Tech and helmet stickers.
- 3. Take Gate card and Tech card to Registration to get checked off for pre-registration or pay your \$65 entry fee. You will receive car numbers to place on your side windows.
- 4. If you don't have a helmet, you can rent one from the club for \$10.
- 5. Your entry fee of \$65.00 includes one lunch and unlimited beverages. Additional lunches can be purchased at Registration for \$7 each.

Women drivers and Novices are classified based upon the car they are driving. We award a Women's Class trophy to the woman with the fastest time, and two Novice trophies to the two fastest novices. This means women and novices will be eligible for multiple trophies. You are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a novice or class trophy you are no longer a novice.

- ALL BMWs through Model Year 1988; E30s through Model Year 1986; all naturally aspirated 4-cylinder models Stock or Modified
- NAS ALL naturally aspiriated, non-M BMWs not in Legacy Class Stock
- NAM ALL naturally aspiriated, non-M BMWs not in Legacy Class Modified
- TS ALL turbocharged BMWs (4-6-8-12 cyl, gas or diesel)
 Stock
- **TM** ALL turbocharged BMWs (4-6-8-12 cyl, gas or diesel)

 Modified
- MS ALL M cars under 400 factory hp Stock
- MM ALL M cars under 400 factory hp Modified
- MPS ALL M cars over 400 factory hp Stock
- MPM ALL M cars over 400 factory hp Modified
- MC ALL R-class MINI Cooper models (Stock or Modified)
- X ALL non-BMW, or Austin MINI models

*Classification for specific cars is at the discretion of the Autocross Director

ONLY Alterations Permitted in Stock Classes:

- ANY air filter or air intake AHEAD OF mass airflow meter
- Non-stock software/firmware is permitted on naturally-aspirated engines only
- ANY brake pad material is allowed with Stock-size brake components
- Catalyst-back exhaust systems and strut tower braces are permitted

ANY other alterations move to Modified Classes, including:

- Tires with DOT treadwear rating under 140
- Non-stock springs, coilover suspensions, nonstock anti-roll bars
- Software/firmware alterations to turbocharged/ supercharged engines
- Non-stock mass airflow meters, camshafts, downpipes, removed catalytic converter
- Non-stock-size brake rotors or calipers (stock-size replacements OK in Stock)

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
