PAUL HOECKE Notes from the road Four Bolts Won't Do It

This being April, I'm reminded that we begin the month with something called April Fool's Day (aka All Fools' Day). This doesn't mean I'll reminisce about the various ways this publication has celebrated this national non-holiday in the dim past. After all, to wax eloquent about how I had a hand in putting out issues titled Tarhell Feetnutz and making up stories about mythical carburetors is likely to raise questions about my state of mind. But then, we saw things a bit differently back then.

That said, however, I must tell you that I've always felt April 1 ought to be dedicated to its infamous patron saint, St. Murphy, the promulgator of Murphy's Law, which is why you're reading this.

As any wrench, amateur or pro, knows all too well, the principal clause of this law – If Anything Can Go Wrong, It Will – has many sub-clauses and corollaries. The few that come to mind at the moment include nuggets such as 'Interchangeable Parts Don't'; 'The Spare Has No Air'; and 'Upon Removal, A Nut Will Drop Into The Least-Accessible Place In The Engine Bay'.

In this instance, however, the one foremost in my mind is: Four Bolts Won't Do It – Ever.

I can blame my long-time friend and automotive collaborator Paul Mele for this bit of shade tree wisdom. Actually, he didn't say it that way, but that's how it turned out. You see, I was telling him about my garden tractor's starter, which had to come out because the pinion – the little starter gear that's supposed to engage the Briggs & Stratton two-banger – had stripped its teeth. And I was bitching up a storm about how hard it would be to get to this vital piece of machinery. Well, I didn't get a lot of sympathy.

Paul merely laughed and said: "Four bolts will do it." What's more, he said the same thing when I pointed out that to get to the starter I'd have to pull the entire engine first. I should've known better; he does stuff like pulling engines all the time. Anyway, as it turned out, I was right. It took a whole lot more than removing four bolts. I suspect Paul was having a bit of fun at my expense. But I'm digressing.

I'm telling you all this because it neatly segues to what this piece is really all about: My Bavaria Project. Now, a few of you out there may be aware of this venture. Although, come to think of it, it's probably not even a few; more like hardly anybody. I guess it's because I don't talk about the project much, for reasons that will become abundantly clear as you read on.

However, a couple of my long-suffering friends, including Paul, certainly are in on it. And I say 'long-suffering' for good reason. The project has been underway for a dog's age – literally. The car, a '72 3.0S according to how Munich saw it, came off the road some twenty years ago! And all this time, these guys have been watching and waiting for progress reports from Yours Truly, to little or no avail. In fact, most of them have given up asking; they just make soothing noises when the subject comes up, which is rarely.

Small wonder they've taken to calling it my 100-Year Project.

But here's the thing. The whole project has been plagued by mission creep almost from the start. It wasn't supposed to be a ground-up restoration, not at first. That term conjures up visions of stripped-to-the-bones chassis, paintwork sanded down to bare metal – in short, a garage queen. And that wasn't what I had in mind. My idea was more like nursing someone back from a medically-induced coma. But as time went by and I ruminated about the car – in between sundry other projects – it kinda dawned on me that I was doing the Bav a grave injustice. It started and ran pretty well; it had very few rust issues (other than some serious cancer on the rear wheel arches); it had a great suspension, upgraded sway bars, Bilstein sports all around, the lot; and its Ansa exhaust still had that mellow burble at idle. Okay, so it was an automatic; but that made it one of only some 800 '72s imported by Max Hoffman. In short, it deserved way more than mere resurrection.

So, decision made, I happily launched into taking the car apart. Not literally, mind you; just enough to find all the rust spots. Thanks to St. Murphy, that took way longer than expected. Between removing seats and other interior stuff, plus exterior bright work, bumpers, grilles, head and taillights – and unwelcome interruptions caused by my paying job – this took months. Months stretched into years. Along the way, I even talked to Scott McDuffie about fixing the wheel arches. But just as I had made real headway with bodywork repairs, I had this brilliant idea of redoing the engine bay too.

That's when the whole process went downhill, or sideways, or whatever.

One thing led to another, namely pulling the

engine and transmission. Of course, that required much more than removing the proverbial four bolts. And then Paul came along with this 3.5-liter mill from an E28 to replace the old 3-liter motor. Actually, this sounded like a Good Idea. The old engine had almost 200K miles on it, and with a lighter car – I had permanently dumped the terrible A/C unit among others – the 3.5 would make the Bav a real barn burner, I thought. Besides, having done a couple of non-BMW engine swaps before, I thought this swap could be fun. It didn't quite turn out that way.

On the bright side, a Bavaria's engine setup is a lot simpler, closer to that aforementioned garden tractor than that of today's BMWs – what Tech Talk's Mike Miller refers to as smart phones on wheels. (Okay, maybe that's a stretch, but if you've read Mike Bird's Gary Derian article in February's ROUNDEL, you know what I mean.) Still, it obviously took a lot more than four bolts to extract the 3-liter, with transmission attached, using a crane. (Because of the Bavaria's suspension, you can't simply raise the car in front and remove the engine from underneath the way Derian did.) And when it came time to zero in on the 'new' motor, it was another Four Bolts situation in disguise. It still is. You see, my intent all along has been to keep the Bav as original as possible. That's including the auto transmission. (Hang me in effigy if you will, but I think Bavarias with 5-speed conversions are a dime a dozen.) Mainly though, the holdup is with the 3.5 mill. It is (or was) Motronic, meaning it must be converted to accept a distributor drive shaft. And that requires replacing the E28's upper timing cover with the Bavaria's, among other items. So far, I've gotten the necessary adaptor, a slotted nut that Paul got me from Jim Rowe of Metric Mechanic fame. But now Paul says I first ought to give the 3.5 mill new gaskets, pull the head, and so forth. Oh boy!

So, figuring I'd get back to the motor in due time, I resumed doing the bodywork, to the point where it's now pretty much done. Most of the rust issues have been fixed; the only one left is those rear wheel arches, and I'm prepared for that. Stashed in our attic is a pair of OEM quarter panels that I wisely (or in a foolishly optimistic moment) bought more than a decade ago. I figured Scott could do excise the rotten panels and weld on the new ones in no time; and matching the original Atlantik Blau paint would be a breeze. So what's the holdup?

Well, as I was wrapping up the bodywork, it

occurred to me that installing the power plant and drive train should come first. Why? Because getting the car to Scott's shop would be a lot easier if it weren't a roller. So now it's back to the motor – and a few other items, such as the brake calipers; and the original transmission; and figuring out the wiring left over after I ripped out the cobbled-together A/C. Oh, and there's also replacing the fuel tank, which is rotten inside and out because the 20-year-old gas it held had long ago turned into an evil-smelling, gooey and evidently corrosive chemical brew

That's where I am today – between two chairs as it were and a long way from the finish. Some might say that better planning would've prevented all that back and forth. Maybe so, but I'm convinced that even then, St. Murphy would've been lurking at every twist and turn. Still, there's light at the end of the tunnel. And if you're looking for a moral to this tale, it's this: Never underestimate St. Murphy.

I'll bet that's something even Paul Mele would agree with.



CLUB RACING REPORT

Spring Preview: VIR, NASA And Other Stuff

Hey, fellow Club Racing fans, welcome to April.

Here's a thought: Whoever it was that said April showers bring May flowers wasn't one of us. Mind you, we have no problem with the May flowers part. But given a choice, showers are not what we, racers and fans alike, look for at any race, any time of the year. And that certainly goes double for the club race at VIR less than a couple of weeks from now.

After all, for most of our homegrown racing crowd – other the diehards who went to Austin for the COTA race last month – VIR is the 2015 season's kickoff event. Having endured a winter with distinctly Arctic characteristics, even here in our neck of the woods, local hot shoes deserve a respite. And you can bet that all those racers heading this way from Up North are even more desperate to put winter behind them. So a weekend free of any precipitation whatsoever would be the proper way to welcome them.

It's no different for those of you who don't race but like to show up and cheer our racing buddies. We hardly need to remind you that, as co-host of the event (with the VDCA), Tarheel Chapter is once again inviting you, your Significant Others and like-minded friends to the annual Club Race Outing held on Saturday (April 11) at the track. It will feature a car corral; a hospitality tent stocked with light refreshments and club regalia; day-long opportunities to watch the race and paddock activities; and a chance mid-day to take your BMW or Mini on a few laps around the 3.27-mile course. And if you need another incentive to attend the Outing, it's the colorful array of vintage racecars that will fill the paddock to capacity. The weekend is the VDCA's season opener as well, so there'll be lots of interesting machinery on the track – including a few 'classic' BMWs, we should add.

As we go to press, the list of entries in the club race – and, we suspect, the vintage event too – is long and getting longer by the day. This year being the 20th birthday of BMW CCA Club Racing (CR), we wouldn't be surprised if this event were to see registrations set a record. And with Brenda Dunlevy, the Strines and other volunteers having everything in place to welcome you to the Out-ing, it certainly promises to be an event you don't want to miss, even if Mother Nature chooses to rain on our parade.

As far as local hot shoes go, about the only thing that might keep some of them away from VIR is the 'Spring Brake' race NASA's Southeast Region is staging at Roebling Road that very same weekend. But given the popularity of the VIR venue, we expect the Roebling Road event to draw mainly drivers who are pretty much committed to the NASA scene, including at least three from our neck of the woods – Phil Franz, Colin Fabeny and Paul Patrick.

In fact, as we reported last month, those three track warriors started the season well before everyone else by taking part in the Southeast Region's 'Winter Meltdown' race at CMP in February. As it turned out, it was Franz who put on the best show. Racing in GTS3 (German Touring Series), he won the class twice, finishing 3rd overall in the first race and first overall the second time around. Meanwhile, Fabeny and Patrick competed with a sizable number of drivers in Spec E30. Both finished in mid-pack in the first race, and Patrick did likewise in the second sprint, but Fabeny did not run.

Both 'local' NASA regions staged races last month. The Mid-Atlantic Region kicked off its season with their 'March Madness' event at VIR; and Southeast held their 'Race for the Pi' at Road Atlanta. However, both events took place after we filed this report, so any word of how local drivers did in either race will have to wait. The same goes for results of the CR race at COTA. Looking down the road, the next two months could be busy ones for members of our homegrown racing crowd – providing they're willing to travel. May has CR events set at Sebring, Mid-Ohio and Barber, although the last two races will be competing for drivers because they take place the same weekend. And NASA's Mid-Atlantic Region will be staging their 'Hyperfest' at VIR. June will offer our hot shoes a chance to burn some rubber at NJMP and, possibly, Watkins Glen. (We say 'possibly' because the Glen is a bit farther than what local drivers have wanted to haul their cars in recent years.)

However, one thing is certain: Tarheel Chapter will not be hosting another Club race at VIR in June. Word is that participation at this event these past few years has been too low to justify our doing it again.

As far as 2014 class championships go, we haven't seen the official results as yet, but a little bird has told us that a few Tarheel Chapter racers have made it to the top, regionally if not nationally. And one result that's definite is April Curtis'

Unfortunately, that race, at Sebring, took place only shortly before this issue hit our website, so results are still pending as far as we are concerned.

However, we should note that BWR will be hosting a club racing school in conjunction with this month's CR event at VIR. Clearly, we would not want Mother Nature to rain on that parade either, so here's some advice: If you happen to be one of the students, don't wash your car beforehand. We have it on good authority – well, sort of – that washing your car is much more effective in conjuring up a cloudburst than any rain dance ceremony. Feel the Thrill Speedway Tour



If you missed the "Feel the Thrill" Tour Sunday, March 8th, you indeed missed a thrill. The tour included a drive with commentary including the history of the track. We learned Bruton Smith built the track in 1959 and he still owns it today. More than 300 events occur there each year featuring many types of racing and entertainment.

We were taken in a van throughout the property. We drove through the paddock, seeing the garages, Pit Row, the 1.5-mile quad oval, the 2.25mile Road Course, the huge HDTV video board and Victory Circle. The video board covers over 16,000 square feet. We had a great view of the grandstands with a seating capacity of 100,000. The seats are painted in different colors to make it appear on TV as if the seats are occupied. In addition, we saw the Go Kart Track, the Dirt Track and the zMAX Dragway. The Dirt Track is 4/10 of a mile long and has several events each year including the Monster Trucks. The zMAX Dragway was built in August 2008 and features the only 4-lane drag strip in the world. The lanes are 1000ft long. In 2012, Massey set a record there with a top speed of 330mph.

But by far, the best part was the drive around the quad oval. It's hard to imagine what "full-tilt force of the 24-degree banking" means until the van stops at the top and you are sitting by the window on the left side. You couldn't ask for more fun except maybe a few more laps around the track in one of the race cars. **-Brenda Dunlevy**


