PAUL HOECKE Notes from the road BMWs Are Like Potato Chips

Sometimes, you discover stuff about yourself only by comparing notes with friends. It's like viewing your mug in a mirror, I guess. Anyway, that's what happened the other day, during one of our Tuesday Bimmer Breakfast Club sessions. (FYI: We're a small, informal group of older car nuts, club members as well as ex-members, the operative description being 'older'.)

So there we were, four of us sipping our coffees and talking cars. After all, it's what we do every week. What was a bit different was the topic we drifted into. Having chewed through our usual subjects – diesel economy; Formula 1; extending the range of all-electric cars; how to keep hackers from screwing with autonomous vehicles; and so forth – we got to talking about how many cars each one of us owns. The result shouldn't have been a surprise, but it was.

It turns out that, collectively, the four of us can claim more than two dozen vehicles as our own. And naturally, about two-thirds of them are BMWs! Wow!

That works out to about six or seven cars per household, which is wa-a-y above the U.S. average of about two-and-change. But like any average, this one is a mixed bag. As any automotive statistics wonk will tell you, about a quarter of all U.S. households have no cars. Most of the rest – about two-thirds – are 'normal' one and two-car households, which leaves a paltry seven percent with three or more passenger vehicles in their garages, driveways and backyards – and places our little group at the high end (call it the insanity level) of that fraction.

Of course, given our love of automotive machinery, this finding merely confirmed what we'd known all along, namely that we are dyed-in-thewool car nuts. So we kinda filed it away and went on to talk about our next road trip. But as we parted ways that day, I couldn't help but wonder how and why I've accumulated multiple vehicles – currently numbering seven, including four BMWs – over the years. Compared to my friends, I couldn't think of a good rational reason (the emphasis being on 'rational').

For one of my (usually) three breakfast buddies, BMWs are a larger-than-life avocation; so much so that it qualifies as a Holy Mission. Aside from his three or (depending on the season) four running Bimmers and the big honkin' diesel pickup, he has probably close to a dozen working projects and projects-to-be, all BMWs, parked around his property. And that's not counting the odd Jag, Caddy and what not he's got squirreled away for futures. That's serious mania.

As for my other two buds, I'd say they belong on the more practical end of the scale, meaning they stick to just three or maybe four vehicles. Mainly, it's for variety; you know, there's a daily driver (or two) and a fun car, plus maybe something like a Mercedes diesel crossover for long trips and an ancient Explorer for hauling mulch. So where does that leave little ol' me?

Granted, there are similarities. I too have an ancient hauler, a '75 F-100 I've owned since it was a mere five years old. And like today, I have always relied on one or two Detroit sedans, usually Fords, to do the family's daily errand work. Invariably, those have come and, after a very lengthy tenure, gone – sold or donated, just like the two Audis and two or three Volvos that have served the needs of various family members over the years. (It's hard to be precise after all the time that's passed.) But as far as my BMWs go, they've always come – and stayed (well, most of them anyway).

Oh, I've lost a few, here and there. But the bald fact is that I have never sold or otherwise willingly parted with a BMW. And (with apologies to the Bard of Avon) that's where the rub is at. Namely, at the risk of being repetitive, I can think of no rational reason why, with parking space around the house at a premium, I'd keep (and work on) four of them.

Add to that the fact that they are all 'classics', which makes them rather more labor intensive than any new car; plus the way I catch myself casting lustful looks at other older Bimmers in the Roundel classifieds, and you can understand my conundrum.

So, having reviewed the evidence and done some serious soul searching, I can come to only one conclusion: I'm addicted to BMWs. Or, to put it in less psychiatric terms, my BMWs are like potato chips:

I can't have just one.

CLUB RACING REPORT

Preview: Tarheel Racing Season 2017

Hello, fellow club racing fans, and welcome to March.

Unlike the official 2017 BMW CCA Club Racing (CR) season which has been underway for the better part of two months, our local racing crowd's season is just getting started. But that's pretty much the norm hereabouts; what with all the uncertainty about the weather this early in the year (witness the storms that hit the Southeast in January), it's smart to wait until Ol' Man Winter is about gone.

The good thing about that is that it allows us to preview what the CR schedule has in store for our homegrown racing crowd in the next few months. And for good measure, we'll toss in what's afoot in the other racing venues local hot shoes tend to favor. So here goes.

The first eastern CR event is this month at Barber. Hosted by Heart of Dixie Chapter, it is scheduled for the last weekend (March 25-26). However, at press time, registration hadn't started as yet, meaning we don't know if any local racers were planning to run in this race. (We do know a few who love the track, but that doesn't mean they'll show up this time around.) We hope to have more details next month.

Next is the race at VIR on the second weekend in April. Co-hosted by Tarheel Chapter with the Vintage Drivers Club of America (VDCA), this 3-day, three-race affair is arguably the first major CR event – at least as far the East Coast is concerned. For one thing, past history says that it will bring a lot of racers, local ones as well as from out of state, to the track. (Unlike Barber, club racers have been signing up for this event since January.) What's more, our annual Club Race Outing on Saturday (April 8) gives the rest of us the perfect opportunity to cheer our friends on the track. And the presence of all that vintage machinery makes this a great spectator event for any car buff.

After VIR, the pace will pick up considerably, with two CR events in May and three each in June and July. However, taking into account distance from our home ground, only about half of these events (if that) are likely to see anyone from our neck of the woods take part. This includes a race at Mid-Ohio on the last weekend in May; one race in mid-June, at Roebling Road; and two in July – at Pittsburgh International early in the month and a week later at Summit Point. That's it for now; we'll leave the rest for later because of the likelihood of future schedule changes or additions.

Meanwhile, NASA's two 'local' regions are looking at a busy year. In fact, the Southeast Region got a jump on everyone by staging their 'Winter Meltdown' race early last month at CMP. And their 'Race for the Pi' is set to run at Road Atlanta a couple of weeks from now. (If you're curious about that event's label – it's derived from its date: 3/18/17. Get it?) However, filing deadlines force us to hold off reporting results for any local hot shoes who raced in either event until next month. The Mid-Atlantic Region, on the other hand, waited until this month to kick off its season at VIR. They're doing it on the same weekend as the CR event at Barber, followed by a race at Dominion late next month. They'll return to VIR in May for their annual 'HyperFest' race.

The ChumpCar Eastern Division also started their season early with a 14-hour race at Road Atlanta last month – but sans any Tarheel teams. However, local drivers are racing in the group's second event, a 12-hour race on VIR's South Course, which is underway as we speak. At this point we know of only one local team, Skidmark Racing, as taking part. But it's a safe guess that

some if not all of the other locals – Bad Brains, No Panic and Red Rooster – are there as well, so look for their stories in next month's issue.

After VIR, the eastern ChumpCar calendar lists eleven more events. However, we expect only two, both of them at VIR, to see any of the local teams compete. The first one is a 24-hour endurance race on the full 3.27-mile course in mid-August; the other one is a Double-8-Hour race on the North Course the first weekend in December. So stay tuned.

As for our local pro team, BimmerWorld Racing (BWR), they kicked off their quest for gold in the IMSA Continental Tire Sportscar Challenge (ICTSC) at Daytona in January. Despite the added challenge of a longer race – four hours instead of the previous 2.5 – their two entries in the Street Tuner (ST) class finished with mixed but encouraging results. Starting 12th, Ari Belogh in the No.81 328i drove the first stint, handing the wheel to Greg Liefooghe while 11th in class. Liefooghe worked his way through the pack and, following a full course yellow, was running second until a mere five minutes before the checker, when he went off course. As a result, he had to be content with finishing seventh.

Meanwhile, the usual No.84 car duo of James Clav and Tyler Cooke was augmented with a new team addition – former Olympic swimming champ Tyler Clary. Recruited by Clay last year and having shown plenty of racing talent during six months' work with BWR, Clary didn't disappoint: He started tenth but had advanced to the fifth spot by the time he finished his stint! Cooke took over and was leading ST when a failed water pump belt forced him to pit for repairs. Fixing the problem cost a lot of lost ground, so that when Clav took over, he was only able to take the checker in 14th place. Notwithstanding these setbacks, Clay felt that BWR's drivers and cars had proved to be a "solid foundation" for the season ahead. As you read this, the team is about to head to Sebring for Round Two of the race series


