PAUL HOECKE Notes from the road Neither A Borrower Nor A Lender Be

The above phrase ought to be familiar to anyone with even a passing acquaintance with Shakespeare's works. (FYI: This one happens to come from 'Hamlet'.) Now, I don't claim to be a devoted student of the Bard's plays, but I've skimmed a few. And I've gotta admit the guy made some pretty insightful observations in his day – including this one. So I've stolen it as today's headline because it seems highly appropriate for what this column is all about.

As I see it, if you're at all concerned about leading a harmonious existence, free from hassles which as likely as not create unnecessary ill will between you and your friends, there are some things you just don't do. And one of them is lending stuff, especially stuff you really care about. (Actually, borrowing belongs here too because it's merely the other side of the same coin, but more on that later.) The ill will happens when said stuff comes back broken, scratched, or otherwise a mere shadow of its former self.

That is assuming it comes back at all.

Aside from your wanting to strangle your buddy the borrower, this leads to self-recrimination of the "I've been such an idiot" kind, which does neither your mental state nor your friendship any good.

CLUB RACING REPORT

Summer Doldrums

Well, fellow club racing fans, this is Summer Time. It's when (according to certain well-known lyrics) the livin' is easy. In our book, that translates to taking time off from work and other daily chores, to kick back, relax and enjoy life whatever fashion pleases you. And what we've heard so far about what our homegrown racing crowd has been up to lately suggests most of them are taking this philosophy to heart.

If nothing else, it makes this report short and sweet, so here goes.

As far as BMW CCA Club Racing (CR) goes, the last couple of months haven't seen all that many local hot shoes hit the track. In May, Dennis Pippy (IP) was the only Tarheel driver in a club event at Mid-Ohio. He finished in all of the weekend's three sprint races, posting a solid second in one of them, but sat out the endurance race.

Local participation in the two CR events in June, at Roebling Road and NJMP's Lightning course, looked to be equally sparse. What's more, because both took place after the deadline for this report, we can only repeat what we said last month – i.e. that the Roebling Road racer list showed only three local hot shoes, Bert Howerton (Spec E36), Todd Newcomer (DM) and Rich Zulman (IP); and that no one from our neck of the woods was listed for the NJMP event. So any further word will have to wait until next month's issue.

This month's CR schedule includes two events in which local racers have been known to participate. One is the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix (PVGP), a huge national event on the weekend after the Fourth. It features among others a

BMWs-only club race at the Pittsburgh International Race Complex. As we filed this report, no Tarheel drivers had signed up as yet, though that may change. On the other hand, the entry list for the race at Summit Point's main track on the next-to-last weekend included at least one local hot shoe: Newcomer again. (He may be looking to catch up in the points chase, but that's just our guess.)

When it comes to NASA Racing, the picture hasn't been all that different. The Mid-Atlantic Region's 'Hyperfest' at VIR in May saw two local track warriors join the fray. Perennial ChumpCar racer Reg Williams posted solo wins in GTS5 in the weekend's two races (presumably to stay in practice for next month's big ChumpCar event at the same track). And Jason Weaver (GTS3) finished in one race but chose to sit out the other one. (So far, we have no word on local drivers racing in the Region's 'June Joust', which ran at Summit Point the weekend of June 10-11.)

Meanwhile, in May, two of our Spec E30 racers, Paul Patrick and Colin Fabeny, showed up at the Southeast Region's race at CMP. Patrick came in second in class in the weekend's first race but finished back in the pack in the other one, as did Fabeny in both races. As for the Region's 'June Jam' at Road Atlanta, that was still in our future at press time, so any news may show up in our next report.

Of course, when it comes to pro racing, there's no rest for the likes of James Clay and his BimmerWorld Racing (BWR) team. As you read this, they are battling their Street Tuner (ST) class competitors in the fourth round of the IMSA Con-

tinental Tire Sportscar Challenge (ICTSC) series at Watkins Glen. As Clay has said before, fine-tuning their two F30-based racecars for each of the often very different tracks in the series has proved to be a tough job, resulting in encouraging finishes as well as disappointing ones. And since the Glen's 3.4-mile course no doubt presents the team with yet another challenge, our eyes will be on IMSA TV's streaming broadcast this weekend. It's the next best thing to being there.


