
OKTOBERFEST 2007

ELECTIONS 2007

Positions available: President Executive Vice President North Atlantic Regional V.P.

South Central Regional V.P.

The BMW CCA National Board represents the BMW CCA membership and as a group is tasked with soliciting and employing up-to-date information and best business practices in carrying out their responsibilities with integrity, honesty, truthfulness and an adherence to the absolute obligation of safeguarding the members' trust. They make sense of new information about the club as it may affect the organization and demonstrate concern for the interests and well being of individuals affected by their actions.

Decisions are made on your behalf at every meeting of the club's Board of Directors, ranging from funding for events and what recreational activities the club will insure, to issues that impact how the club is governed, what appears in Roundel and on the website, to global issues like the club's involvement with the International Council of BMW Clubs. The nine people comprising the national board have the fiduciary responsibility for the entire organization.

It is vitally important that those volunteering understand that there will be a lot of tough decisions, a lot of late nights on the phone and in front of the computer, and more than a handful of weekends away from home. Mostly they need to know that they are ultimately responsible for the continued health of this organization. To better help you assess whether you want to run, copies of the job descriptions will be emailed to you on request. The Club needs qualified volunteers who are able to treat their hobby like a business and devote the same attention to the club as they would to their regular job.

Candidates must be nominated by a member who has been a member for at least six months prior (the nomination must include the BMW CCA membership number of the nominating person and the candidate's acceptance of the nomination should be countersigned on the same page (including the candidate's own membership number). Nominees for Regional Offices, and those nominating them, must reside and be a chapter member in the specific region. In order to run for election to the position of BMW CCA President, a member must first have served as a member of the BMW CCA Board of Directors in one of the other national officer positions.

Nominations should include a candidacy statement of **no more than 300 words** and an appropriate photograph of the candidate. Those wishing to help in refining the CCA's strategic framework: its values, vision, mission and broad goals; those wishing to help formulate and refine policies that govern our practices should send their nominations, acceptances, candidacy statements and photographs to be received at the National Office **before 5 PM EST October 31, 2007.**

At the last Board Meeting one of the board members raised the idea of term limits for all positions (currently only the president is limited to how long s/he can hold office). You may have received a solicitation to participate in a survey concerning how members perceive the election process, if not, send me an email and I'll send you the link. It won't take you more than two or three minutes and will be very helpful to the club.

Many of you know that *the Tire Rack Street Survival* program is large focus of the BMW CCA Foundation. Without the help of the BMW CCA chapters, the Foundation wouldn't be able to host the *Street Survival* schools. Recently, the Foundation approached another milestone when we received some very exciting news. A twelve-year BMW CCA member of the Bayou chapter (who has asked to remain anonymous) donated his beloved '95 BMW E36 M3 to the Foundation. He wants the car to be raffled off so that the proceeds can be used to further the great programs and good works the Foundation has undertaken.

He is the original owner and knows the car inside and out. The car is in excellent condition and was produced in December 1994. Hellorot red with black leather Vader seats.
